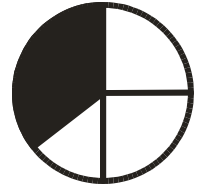

TOGAF at the crossroads?



- ❑ **Traditionally an annual publication of TOGAF X**
 - Is a great discipline and has created an annual expectation
 - Fits with an annual company review, planning and resource allocation cycle
- ❑ **Drivers for change**
 - Multiple versions of TOGAF
 - Certification requires a stable standard
 - Investors in TOGAF and certification need a known return period
 - The Forum's work is becoming more diverse
 - The weight of information is becoming greater
 - Different types of information require different lifecycles
- ❑ **Transition**
 - Publish TOGAF 8.1? In December
 - Include proposal for new lifecycles in the company review
 - New approach from 2004
 - Possibly separation of certification numbers from TOGAF numbers

- ❑ Develop new strategy for TOGAF releases
- ❑ Finalize content of TOGAF 8.1?
