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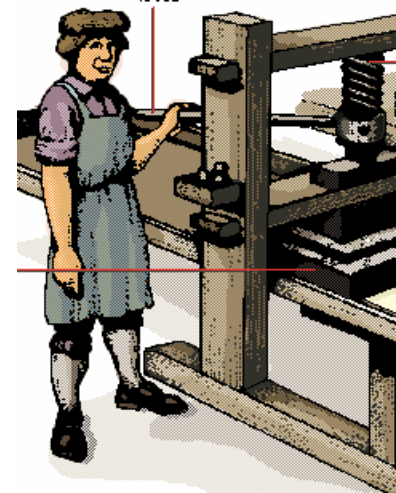

- ❑ “So far, for 50 years, the information revolution has centered on data ...
 - their collection, storage, transmission, analysis, and presentation
- ❑ It has centered on the "T" in IT
- ❑ The next information revolution asks,
 - What is the MEANING of information, and what is its PURPOSE?”

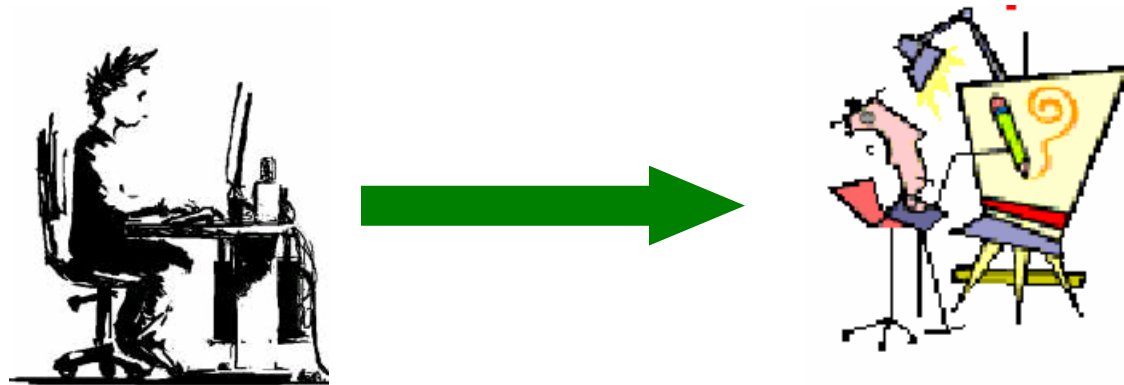
Evolution from “T” to “I”

- By 1580 or so
 - Printers, with their focus on technology, had become ordinary craftsmen, respectable tradesmen to be sure, but definitely not of the upper class.
 - Their place was soon taken by what we now call publishers (though the term wasn't coined until much later), people and firms whose focus was no longer on the "T" in IT but on the "I."

History repeating itself?

- ❑ Software development with its focus on technology, is being off-shored and outsourced
- ❑ Their place is being taken by what we now call architects (though there remains some discussion around the definition of the term), people and firms whose focus was no longer on the "T" in IT but on the "I."

A revolution in concepts

- ❑ “The next information revolution is well under way. But
- ❑ it is not happening where information scientists, information executives, and the information industry in general are looking for it.
- ❑ It is not a revolution in technology, machinery, techniques, software, or speed.
- ❑ It is a revolution in CONCEPTS.”

 - Cars, Retail
- ❑ Integrated information
 - Accelerated time to value
- ❑ Service Oriented Architecture
 - Focusing on the “S” not the “T”

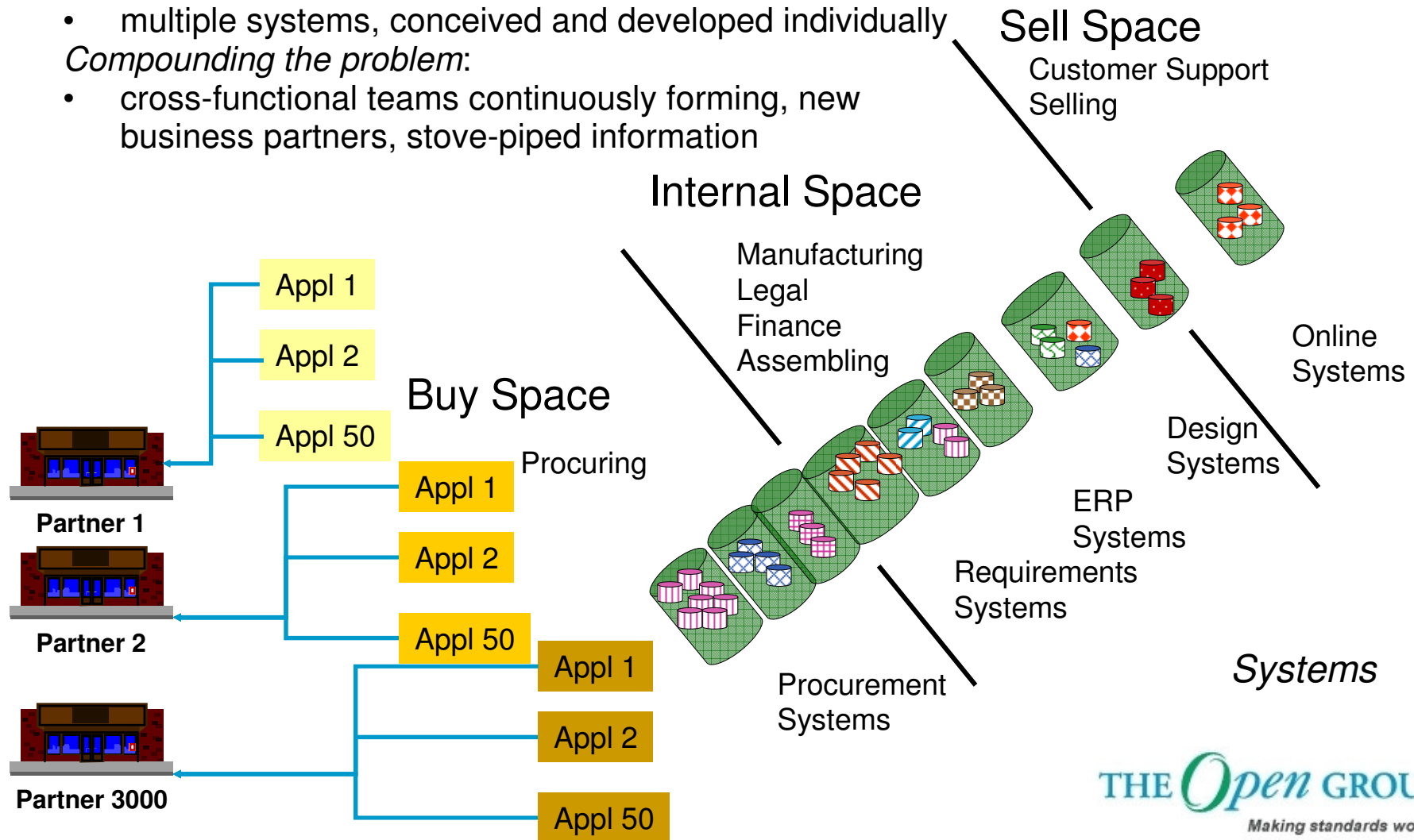
A common problem

The cause:

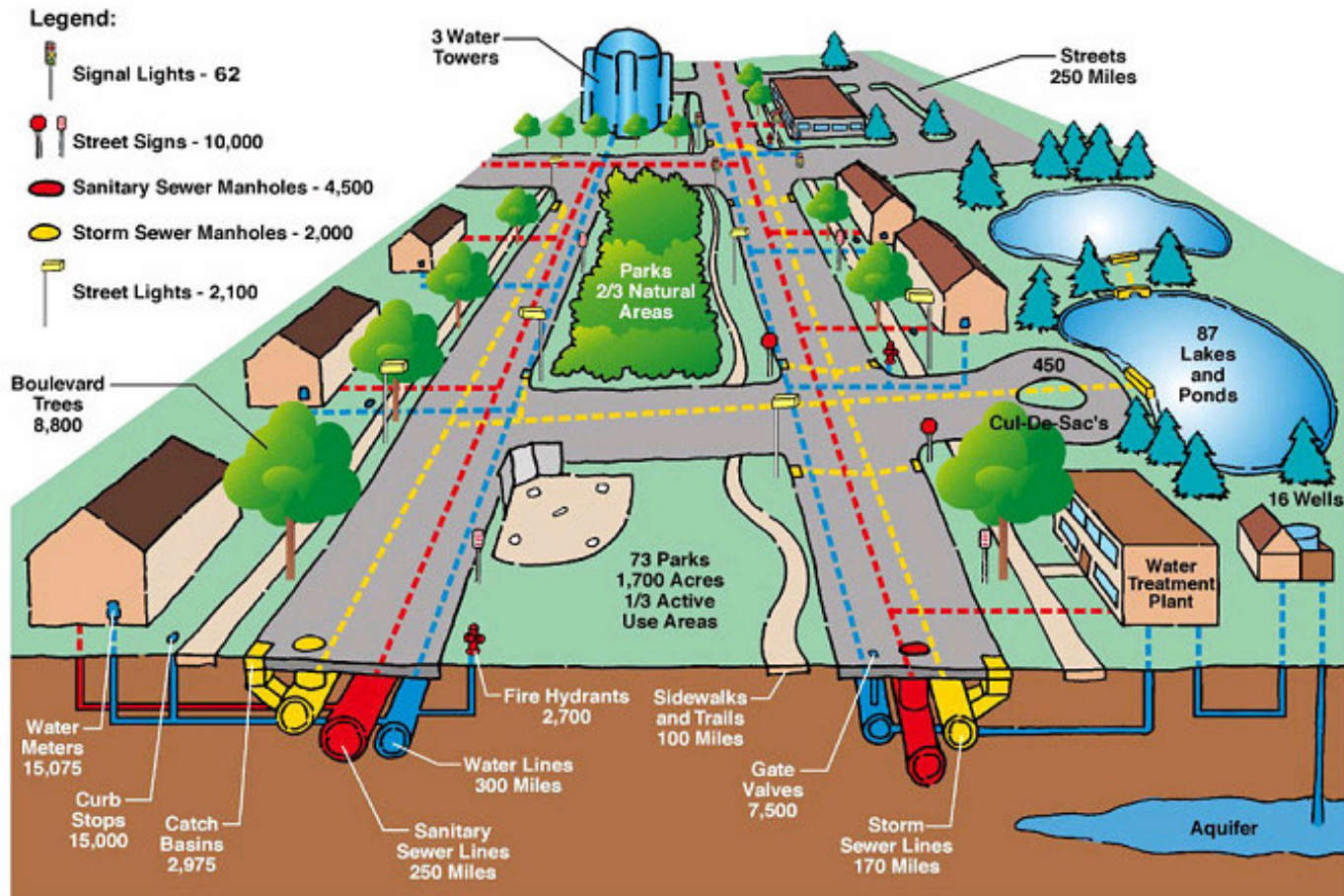
- multiple systems, conceived and developed individually

- ❑ How do you know a person/organization/tool is certified?
 - Trademark
 - Public register
- ❑ A click to accept agreement
- ❑ Licensing a trademark logo means trademark law can be used to prevent false claims (passing off)

Testing



- Testing via Course Attendance
 - Satisfactory completion of a qualifying training course
 - Minimum of 4 days
 - Assessment by the Certified Instructor

Testing



- Testing via examination
 - Examination covers knowledge of the TOGAF 8 Course Syllabus
 - Multiple choice questions
 - One correct answer
 - 101 questions
 - Pass mark is 70%

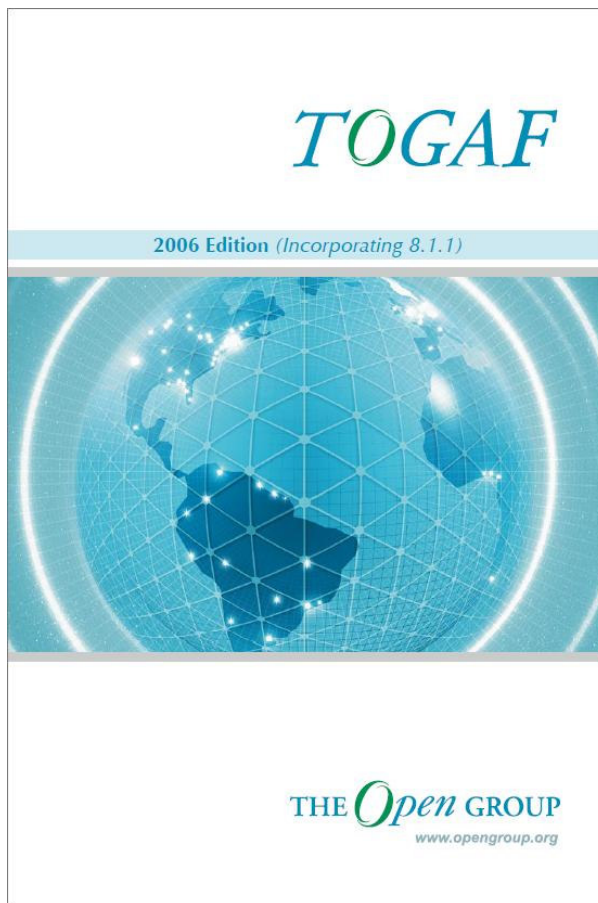


Summary

- ❑ TOGAF Certification is a key piece to the solution.

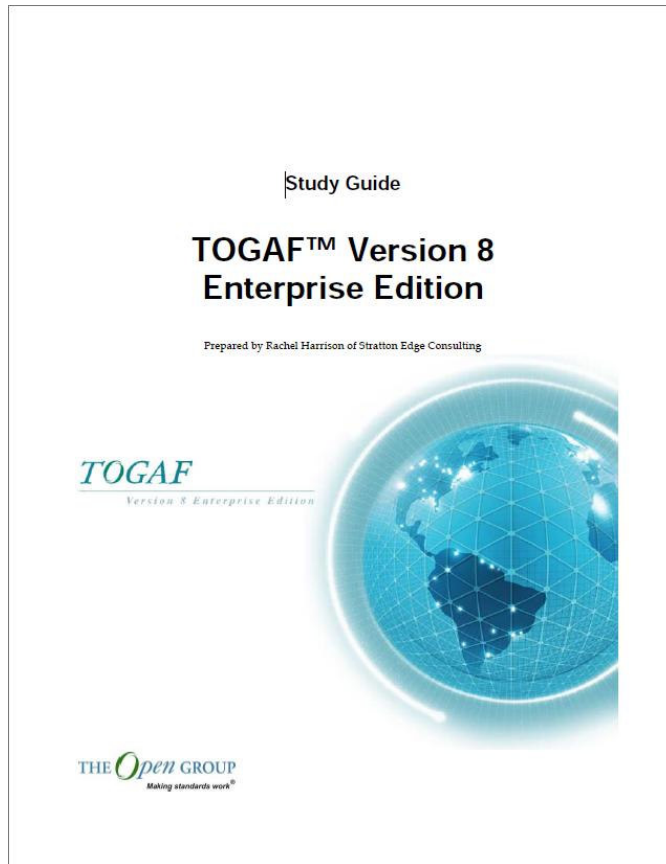
