Background

- ❑ TOGAF Version 8 “Enterprise Edition” published December 2002
 - Radical change and expansion from Version 7
 - TOGAF Version 7 “Technical Edition” (published December 2001) frozen
- ❑ TOGAF Certification launched February 2003
 - Limited to TOGAF 7
- ❑ Structure:
 - One class of certification for individuals (practitioners)
 - Three classes of certification for organizations (tools, training, professional services)
- ❑ TOGAF 7 approved registrations by end-2003:
 - 29 for individual practitioner certification
 - 11 (from 8 different companies) for tools, training, professional services certification.

Background (continued)

- ❑ TOGAF Version 8.1 published December 2003
 - Incorporate industry feedback
 - Incremental added value
- ❑ TOGAF 8 Certification launched February 2004, based on TOGAF Version 8.1
- ❑ At launch of the TOGAF 8 Certification Program:
 - 16 approved registrations for individual practitioners;
 - 6 registrations from 3 different companies for tools, training, and professional services certification.
- ❑ ~1500 Downloads of TOGAF Version 7 to end-2002
- ❑ ~3100 Downloads of TOGAF Version 8 to end-2003
- ❑ ~ 600 Downloads of TOGAF Version 8.1 already in 2004

Objectives

- ❑ A vendor-neutral, global basis of certification to impose standards for Enterprise Architecture within the profession
- ❑ Ensure consistency in the market between tools and services supporting TOGAF 8 from different vendors and service providers
- ❑ Maintain and enhance the value of TOGAF 8 to enterprise customers.

Scope

- ❑ *Architecture Practitioners* – having the knowledge to use TOGAF 8 effectively
- ❑ *Training courses* – qualified instruction in the use of TOGAF 8
- ❑ *Professional services* - offered in accordance with TOGAF 8 Code of Practice
- ❑ *Architecture tools* - supporting TOGAF 8 and its Architecture Development Method



Operation

- ❑ Licensees may use the term "TOGAF 8" together with The Open Group Certification Mark in association with products and/or services



- ❑ The Open Group:
 - publishes definitive register of certified products / services / people
 - issues certificates for use by vendors in promotion

Motivations for IT Customers

- ❑ Enterprise Architecture increasingly important for ensuring that IT properly addresses enterprise needs.
- ❑ Customers can now procure professional services, tools, and training, on the basis of certified conformance to the open, industry standard TOGAF 8.
 - Avoid lock-in to proprietary methods.
- ❑ Vendor has made legally binding warranty of conformance to a published industry standard
 - Not only at registration - throughout product / service lifetime.
 - Procurers can freely access the Statement of Conformance by the vendor, and compare with those of other certified vendors.

Motivations for Vendors and Service Providers

- ❑ Increased motivation for customers to procure products and professional services
- ❑ Demonstrates a commercially responsible approach to the supply of offerings to the market
 - warranty of conformance to a published industry standard

TOGAF 8 Certified (Practitioner)

- What certification means:
 - Certificant has acquired sufficient knowledge of TOGAF 8 to apply it in architecture work:
 - in a well defined manner
 - consistently across different architecture projects

TOGAF 8 Certified (Practitioner)

- ❑ TOGAF's open-ness creates benefits via short term savings and medium term gains in substance
- ❑ Use of TOGAF avoids lock-in
- ❑ Motivations for certification: suppliers of architecting services (internal or third-party)
 - Increased ability to recruit staff of known knowledge levels
 - Increased ability to retain and motivate quality staff
 - Advantages in winning business and premium pricing opportunity
 - Reduced claims and lawsuits (due diligence)

TOGAF 8 Certified (Practitioner)

- ❑ Motivations for certification: individual architects
 - Ability to identify and fill gaps in skills
 - Improved job prospects
 - Freelancers can establish their credentials
 - Personal satisfaction and motivation from the assessment process
 - New knowledge, learning and contacts from the network of certified architects

TOGAF 8 Training

- ❑ What certification means:
 - Course syllabus covers all the necessary elements of TOGAF 8
 - in a well defined manner
 - consistently in different courses
 - via a detailed TOGAF 8 TRAINING Conformance Statement
 - Enables participants to acquire necessary knowledge and awareness of TOGAF 8 to use it effectively in Enterprise Architecture work

TOGAF 8 Training

- Motivations for certification:
 - Strong supporter of TOGAF and The Open Group's business value
 - Provides a means to grow TOGAF 8 skilled resources in the industry and globally
 - Defines the quality standards for TOGAF 8 training
 - Proves the value of the training provided
 - Share knowledge with other TOGAF 8 Certified services and practitioners through the Architecture Forum
 - Grow the TOGAF business and markets

TOGAF 8 Professional Services

- What certification means:
 - Company subscribes to TOGAF 8 Code of Practice
 - Company has TOGAF 8 Certified staff
 - (Optionally) Company has staff capable of using TOGAF 8 certified tools

TOGAF 8 Professional Services

- Motivations for certification:
 - Demonstrates company commitment to best practice
 - Reinforces the company's vendor-independent solution provider message
 - Demonstrates the company's commitment to training and people development

TOGAF 8 Tool Support

- ❑ Why Use an Tool for TOGAF (why not Visio and Word)?
 - To capture, verify and maintain the graphical and textual information created throughout the ADM
 - To support relationships between components of this information across architecture domains
 - To enable validation of the developing architecture against business requirements and objectives
 - To facilitate impact analysis across architecture domains
 - To enable use of consistent architecture standards and principles
 - To improve communication and understanding between business and IT
 - To enable sharing of this information among many stakeholders
 - To provide the “master version” of the Enterprise Architecture
- ❑ A simple drawing tool cannot do this
 - A picture may speak 1000 words, but
 - A set of architecture models, integrated in an architecture tool, speaks 1000 pictures

TOGAF 8 Tool Support

□ What is Tool Certification

■ Aim

- to ensure that the meaning of a claim of conformance is clear and that the TOGAF ADM is supported consistently in different architecture tools

■ Defined by the TOGAF Product Standard

- Conformance Statement Questionnaire (CSQ) describes how the tool meets the standard

□ Benefits of Tool Certification

■ For the supplier:

- Confidence in being a member of a well-respected “club”
- Improved access to the EA market place

■ For the customer:

- Confidence in the TOGAF “brand”
- Confidence in the supplier’s commitment to and understanding of EA
- Ability to draw on the experience of the supplier and other organizations

TOGAF 8 Tool Support

- What a TOGAF tool needs to do (summary from CSQ)
 - Support ADM and core deliverables
 - Support use of the Enterprise Continuum
 - Support use of core TOGAF techniques
 - Support multiple viewpoints and views
 - Support tracking against requirements
 - Support re-use and integration
 - Enable production of core ADM documents and models
 - Support commonly-used modeling methods and architecture frameworks
 - Enable shared use by multiple concurrent users
 - Should be customizable

TOGAF 8 Tool Support

- Popkin Software motivations for certification (what we said in 2003)
 - In tune with Popkin's mission statement as "The Enterprise Architecture Company"
 - Contributes to the goal of business-IT alignment
 - Opportunity to reach organizations doing architecture
 - Popkin already a Zachman partner
 - System Architect already supports
 - Zachman Framework
 - DoDAF
 - Federal Enterprise Architecture Reference Models
 - IT architecture in a business context (TOGAF 7)
 - Enterprise edition (TOGAF 8) – it's what we do hence
 -TOGAF support in SA a logical next step

TOGAF 8 Tool Support

- Popkin Software motivations for certification (what we're saying now in 2004)
 - TOGAF 8 (Enterprise edition) – it's what we do
 - In tune with Popkin's mission statement as “The Enterprise Architecture Company”
 - A growing Enterprise Architecture market place:
 - More organizations doing EA
 - Greater understanding “out there” of what EA is and what it is for
 - Our customers are asking
 - How do you “do” EA
 - How do you populate a (Zachman) framework
 - Our answer is
 - Use TOGAF 8 to populate your (Zachman) framework cells

In other words

- Certification is good for us
- Certification is good for our customers

- ❑ What's new in SA-TOGAF 8 support (SA v9.2)
 - New TOGAF 8 framework graphic
 - New TOGAF Help, includes TOGAF 8
 - TOGAF 8 Sample encyclopedia
 - Improved definition of core TOGAF 8 products
 - Improved diagrams for technology modeling
 - TOGAF 8 standard report sets
 - Word
 - HTML

Conclusions

- ❑ Customers can now procure TOGAF 8 certified tools, training, professional services.
 - ... and avoid lock-in to proprietary methods.
- ❑ Individuals can now demonstrate to employers and peers their knowledge of the TOGAF 8 industry standard for Enterprise Architecture.
 - ... and their commitment to Enterprise Architecture as a discipline
- ❑ **With the benefit of certification, TOGAF 8 is now more than ever the logical choice as the basis for Enterprise Architecture work.**
