Abstract

- Certification does not guarantee great architectures

 - But rather
- Certification produces criteria that guides professional development!
- Certification does improve your chance of success in finding a great architect!
- Certification does improve your chance of getting great architectures – made by ever improving body of professionals!

- It is somewhat an ethical responsibility



Draft Code of Ethics from AOGEA

- Canons

CANON I: General Obligations

 Members should maintain and advance their knowledge of the art and science of architecture, respect the body of architectural accomplishment, contribute to its growth, thoughtfully consider the social and environmental impact of their professional activities, and exercise learned and uncompromised professional judgment.

CANON II: Obligations to the Public

 Members should embrace the spirit and letter of the law governing their professional affairs and should promote and serve the public interest in their personal and professional activities.

CANON III: Obligations to the Client

 Members should serve their clients competently and in a professional manner, and should exercise unprejudiced and unbiased judgment when performing all professional services.

CANON IV: Obligations to the Profession

Members should uphold the integrity and dignity of the profession.

CANON V: Obligations to Colleagues

 Members should respect the rights and acknowledge the professional aspirations and contributions of their colleagues.





Views on Certification from Real People

- "I think that certification can be very useful for both consumers and for the professionals who are being certified. For consumers, cert. tells people that the person they're considering meets certain qualifications and has completed a certain amount of training. Some certs also require people to maintain their training, to keep it up to date. So with cert, consumers can know that the person with the cert. has met some training standards.
- Also, for the professional, cert. helps limit the number of people who can have the qualifications that are needed for the cert. This can be very helpful for a lot of reasons."

- "In my field, I think it is essential. I am certified/credentialed as a clinical nurse specialist and as a nurse practitioner. It means that I graduated from the appropriate programs that meet certain criteria, have passed certification exams and am up-to-date with continuing education requirements. Certification, as well as licensing, is required in order to be able to treat and prescribe and to bill insurances for my service. If I provided unsafe care my licenses would be at risk in order to protect potential clients. Were I seeking treatment, I wouldn't want to entrust my care to someone who did not meet these minimum standards."

TOGAF 9 Certification Issues Addressed

Training

- Level of governance and audit?
- Prefer to audit that a quality system in place, not audit courses.
- Require trainers to have a formal trainer qualification?

Tools

- Agreed its important.
- Conformance criteria are weak.
- More than just modeling. How to move this forward?
- Might revise Tools certification out of cycle.

Trainee/Individual

- Need minimum conformance requirements.
- Large numbers of certifications, or a higher knowledge?
- Do we need to certify everybody? Practitioner certainly most important!
- Compare with industry best practices!
- Support English as 2nd language!

Professional services

- Did we get this right?
- What is the value to the client?
 - Perceived assurance, but no conformance to assure it!
- Can we truly govern it?

Professional Services Certification Strategy Statement

- Enable the Professional Service providers to utilize the TOGAF brand
- Certify that
 - Service providers are trained in TOGAF
 - Promote use of certified TOGAF tools, and
 - Adhere to a TOGAF code of practice
- For each of these there will be
 - Open process to develop conformance requirements
 - Process for providers to assert conformance
 - Process for assessment of the assertion for conformance, and
 - Communication process for publicizing certificates of compliance
- Critical to this strategy is the involvement of
 - Professional Service providers
 - Professional Service customers
 - Certification Standing Committee, and
 - The Open Group Staff
