- Enterprise Architecture is being discovered as a useful tool in the realm of strategic planning
- All industry verticals have created a set of models specific to their area of endeavour
- Many of the management frameworks have come up with their certified processes (e.g. ITIL, PRINCE2, PMI, SIX SIGMA, Balanced Scorecard)
- TOGAF provides a unifying process that enables the systematic creation of the models and integrates the various frameworks
- The totality of these frameworks are the tools with which strategic planners execute their mandate.

- Mike was one of the pioneers of TOGAF. As Chief Technical Officer for The Open Group, he was the Technical Editor for the IEEE 1003.0 architecture standard in the late 1980s and responsible for the development of TOGAF with The Open Group until the publication of TOGAF 8.
- Mike joined X/Open Company Limited (the predecessor of The Open Group) in 1994 from ICL, where he had a variety of roles leading up to Chief Architect for OMAC 29, ICL's flagship product for the Manufacturing Industry and Design Authority for all ICL's vertical application products.
- As Chief Technical Officer, Mike was responsible for The Open Group's technical strategy and presided over the standardisation of UNIX.
- On his retirement from The Open Group in April 2003, Mike was appointed as the first Fellow of The Open Group, in recognition of his extensive contribution to the development of Open Systems and Architecture.
