#### Actual agenda

- Participants were few, all from suppliers and familiar with the project
- Brief report on conferences in Minneapolis and London, future regional conferences, guide books
- Fruitful discussion of the strategy's implementation

### Implementation steps: Inner Source

- There are successful examples for this in existence
- Proposal: Set up a half-day session presenting and discussing examples
- Goals:
  - Spread the best practice
  - Potential to build a community for sharing best practices
- This should create strong interest by believers and critics



# Implementation steps: Engaging Open Source communities

- Disseminate documents and deliverables for comment and input.
- Proposal: Spread the word about member activities in the OS community
- Goals: Increased awareness and support for programs from The Open Group membership



# Implementation steps: Open Source SW licensing

- Interesting, diverse and partially too controversial for making progress
- Proposal: Define a project to group licenses by degree of compatibility
- Goals:
  - Simplify life for new initiatives who need to select a licensing regime
  - Motivate some convergence of licenses
- This could be very valuable for adoption of Open Source



### Implementation steps: Standards and Certification

- An area of confusion
- Proposal: Develop clarifying documents and presentations
- Goals:
  - Publish a set of accepted definitions for standards, implementations
  - Describe the motives for certification
- Removes ambiguities and misunderstandings, and promotes use of Certification

# Implementation steps: Fulfill Business Requirements

- This area is plagued by misinformation and fear
- Proposal: Develop case studies, guides
- Goals:
  - Remove FUD
  - Help adoption of Open Source in the right situations
- This is particularly relevant in Enterprises



#### **Regional Conferences**

- These are intended to move towards smaller regional Conferences with less support by Open Group staff
- Intent is to use local language materials
- Supplier Council members likely to take the lead
- Intent is to develop re-useable templates for organization, agenda
- Locations under discussion: Germany, Boston, Tokyo



#### San Diego

- Investigate feasibility of a sequence of stand-alone Open Source sessions, e.g.:
  - Inner Source
  - Open Standards, Open Source, Certification
  - Grouping of licenses
  - Applying concept and code of Pegasus to appliances (wireless, cell, routers, print, ...)
- This will draw different audiences, with some overlap
- Proceedings could be of wide interest
