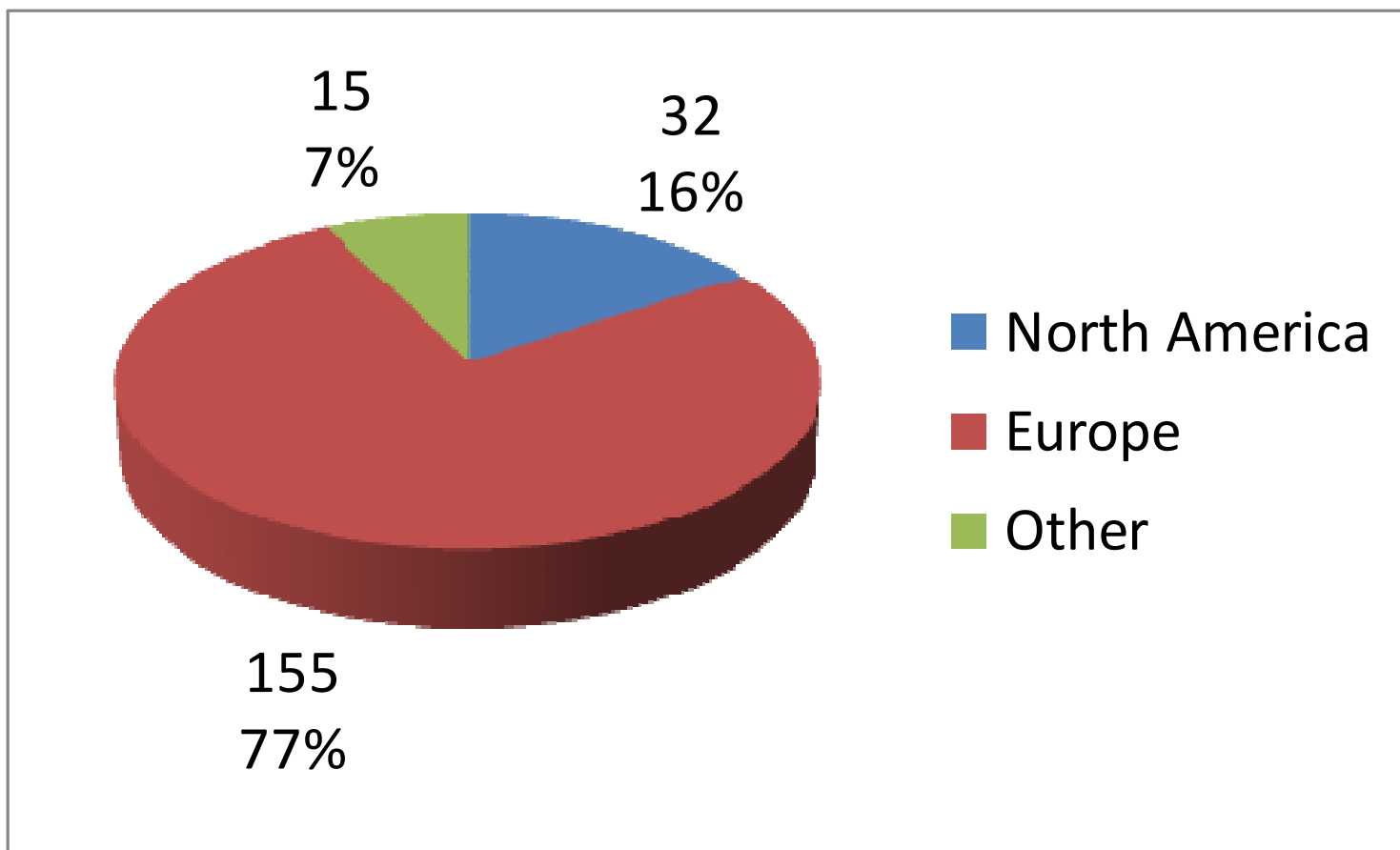

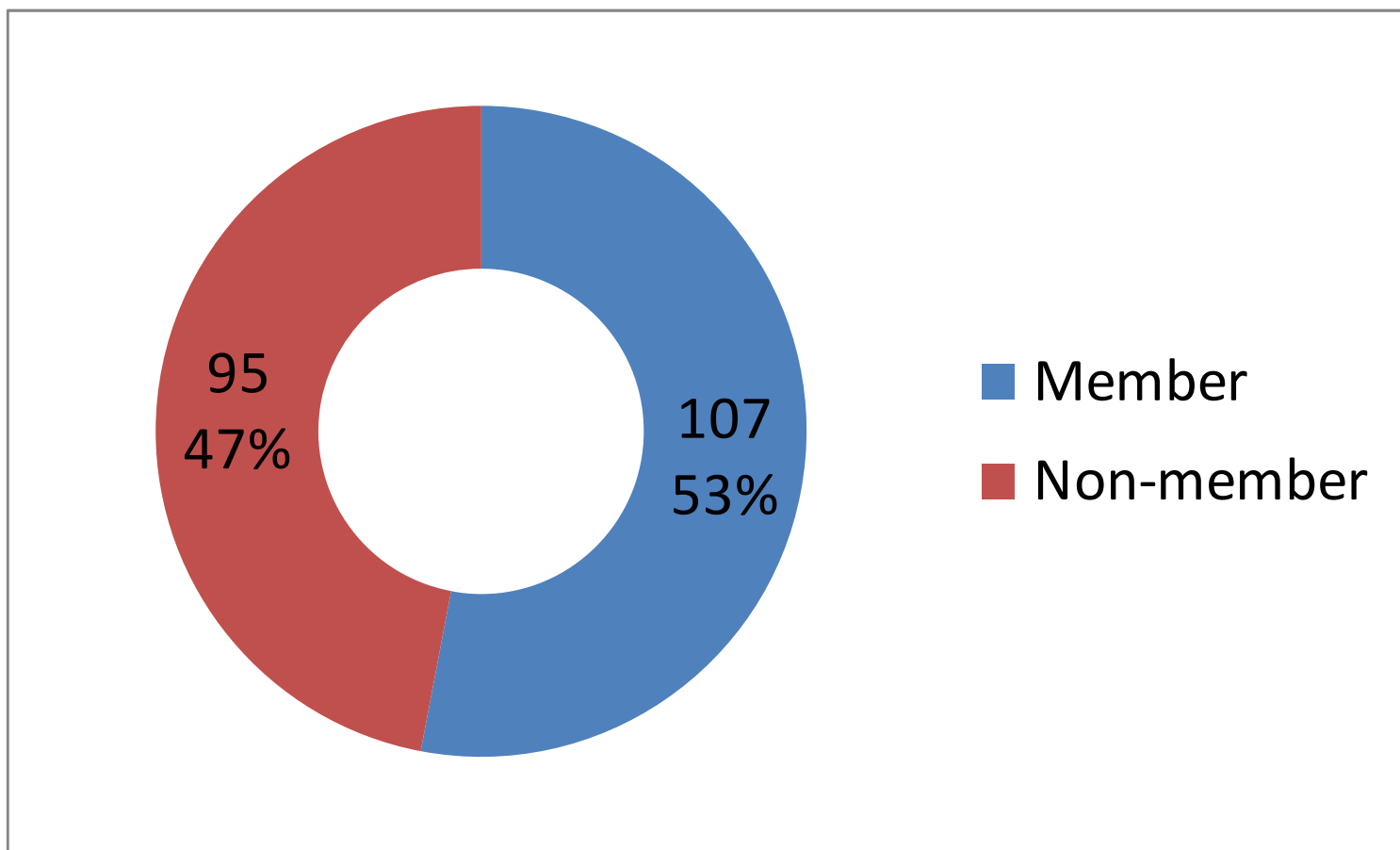

Geographic Representation

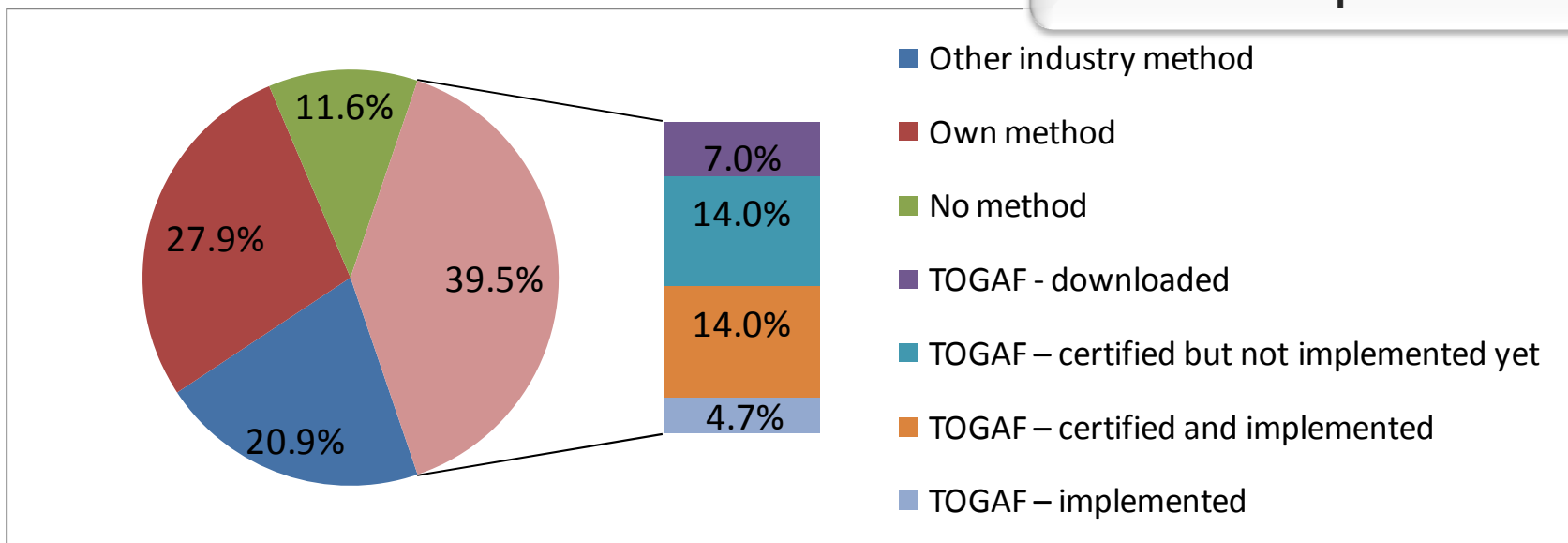

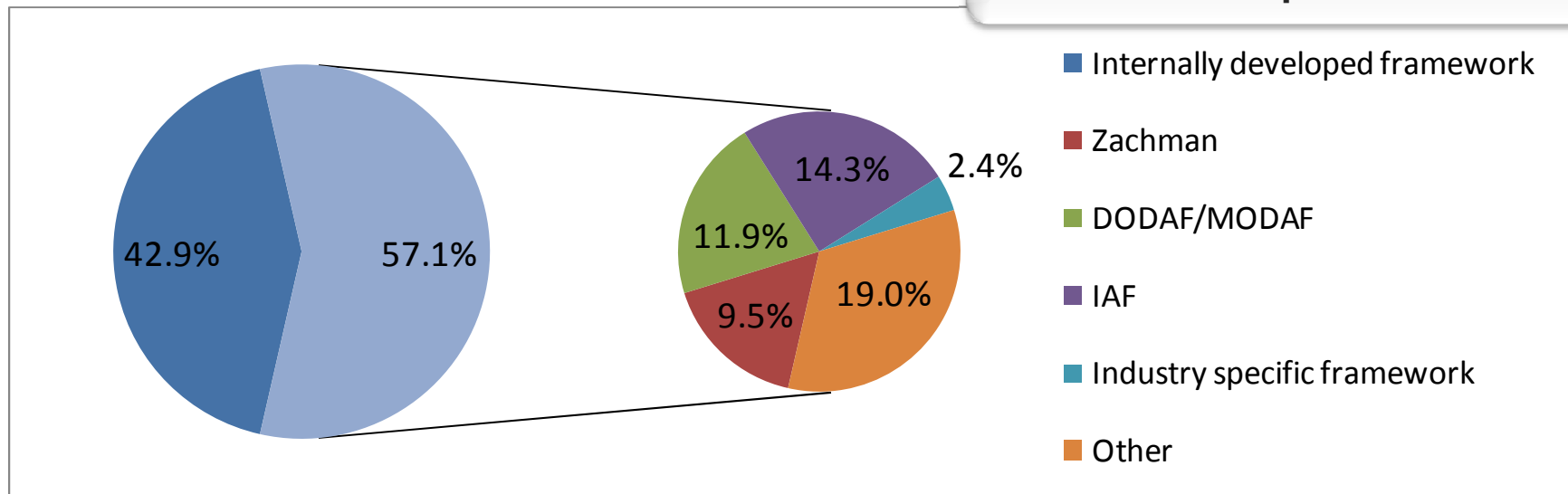

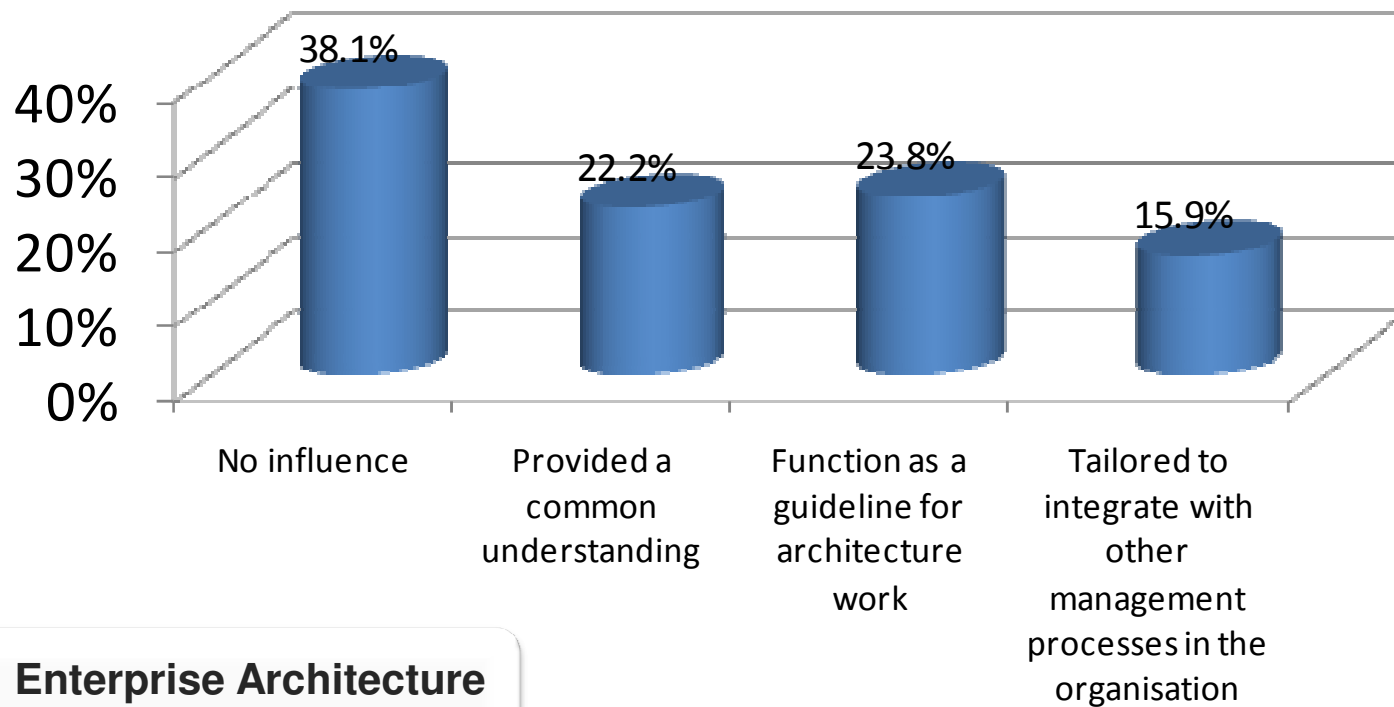


EA Framework Used

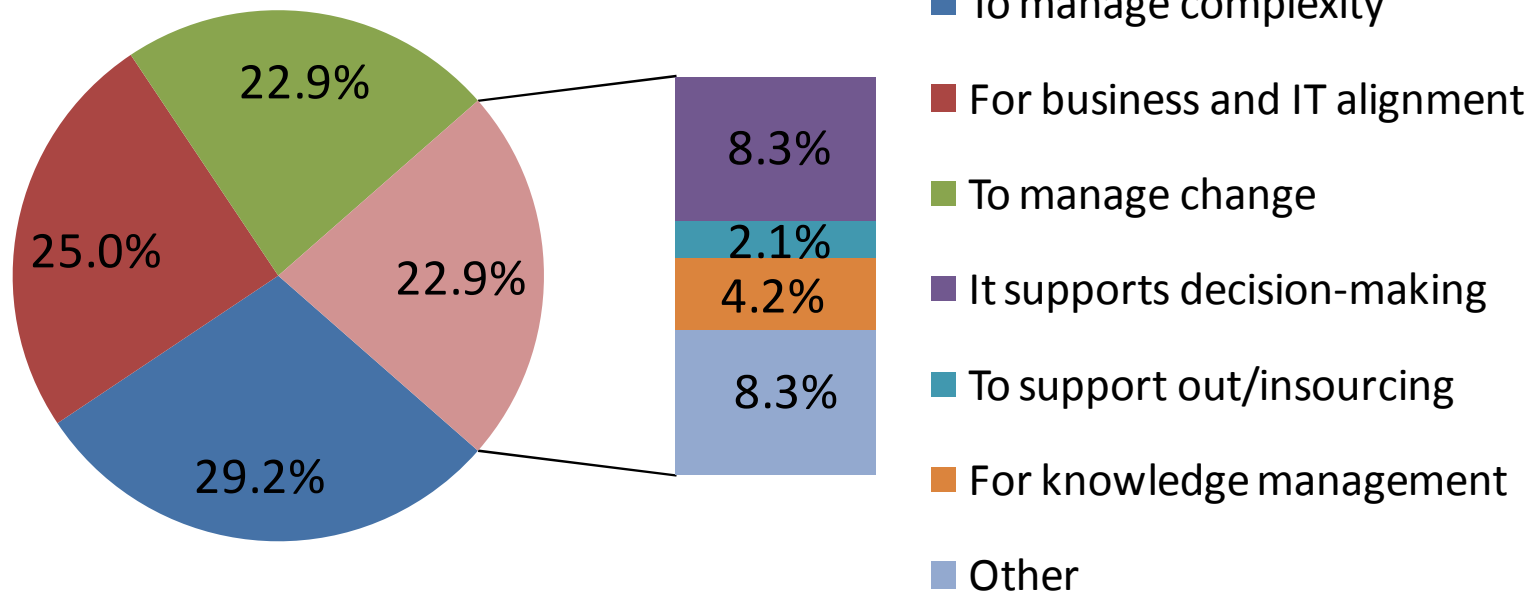

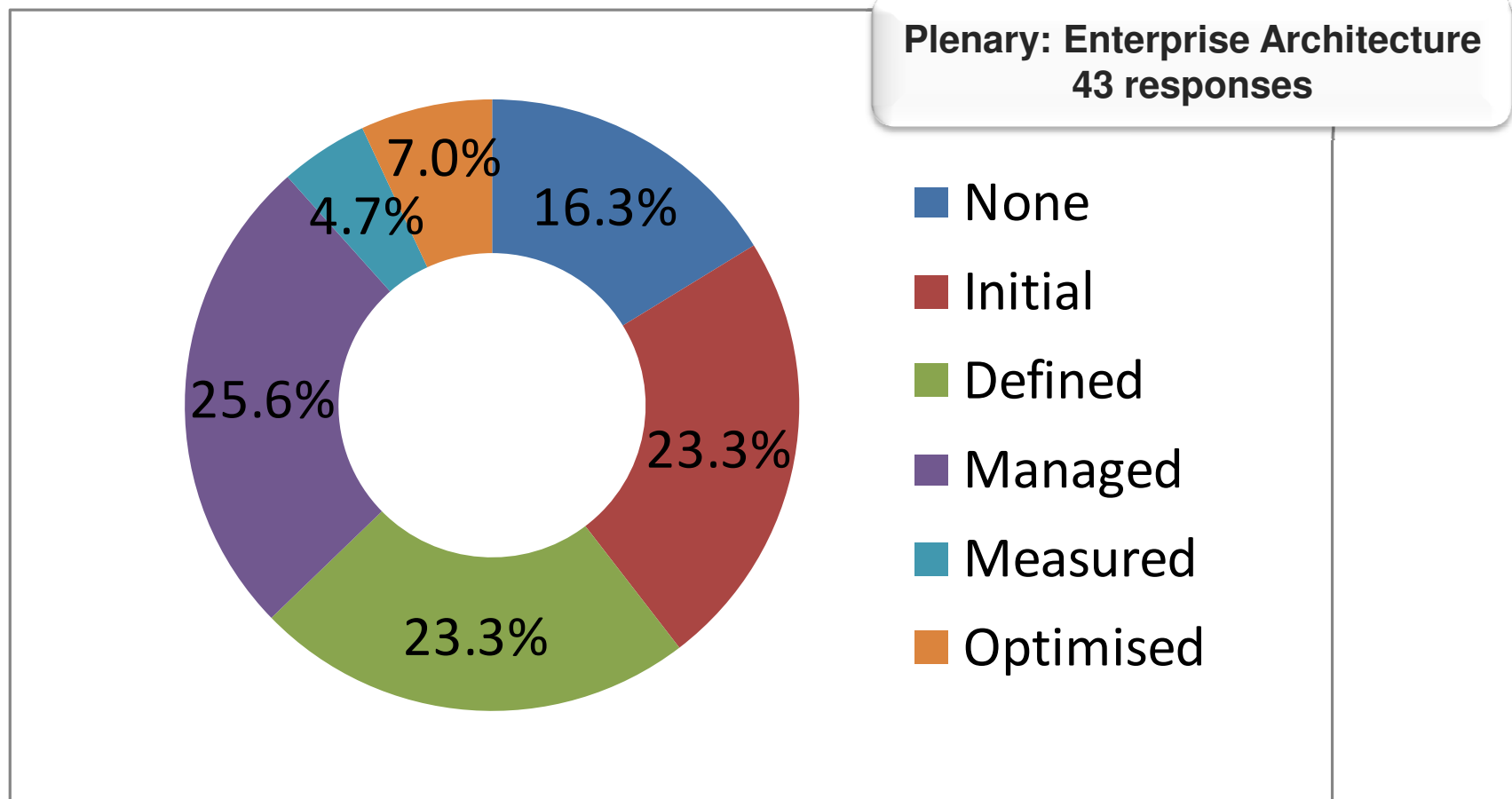

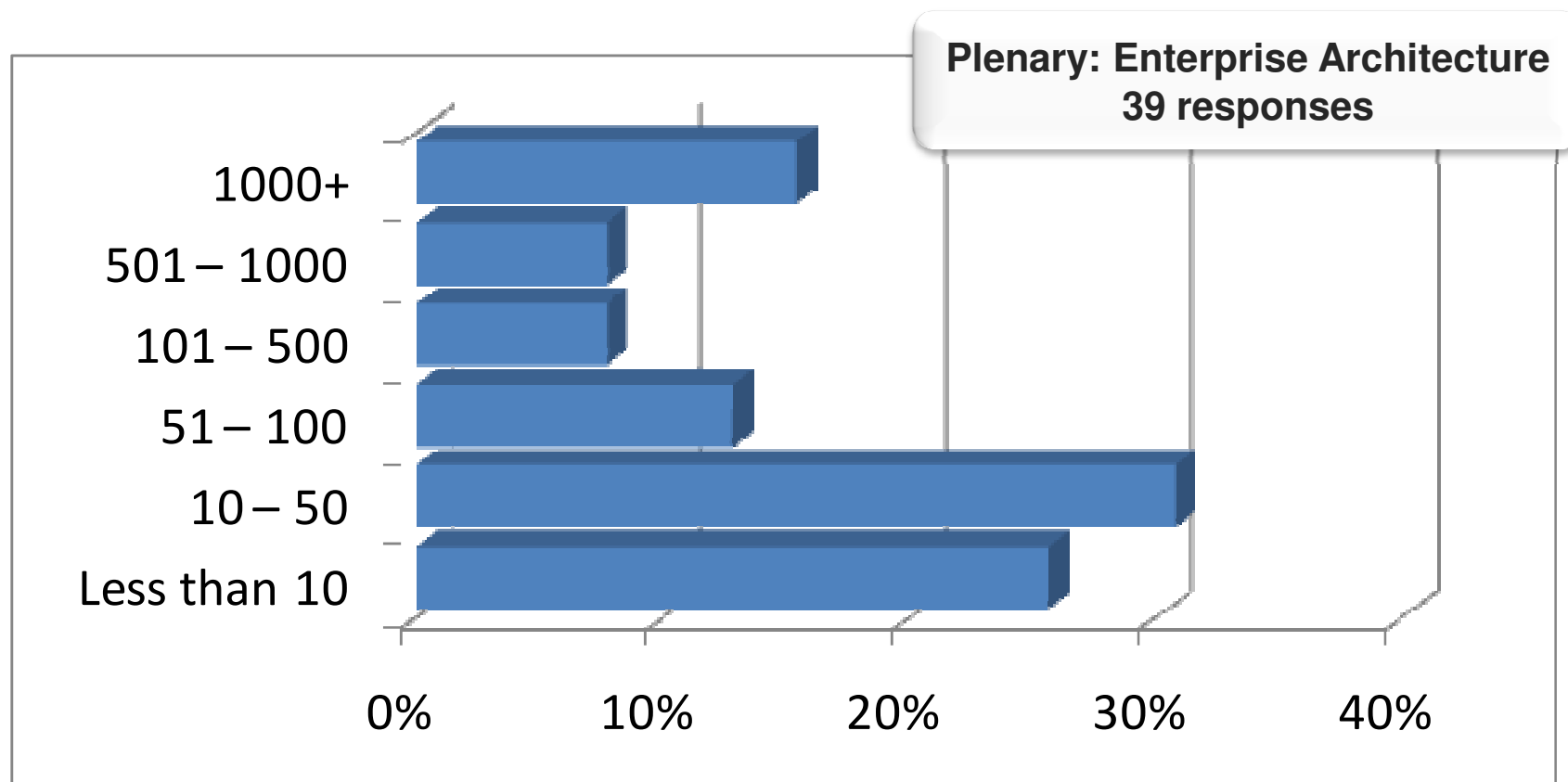

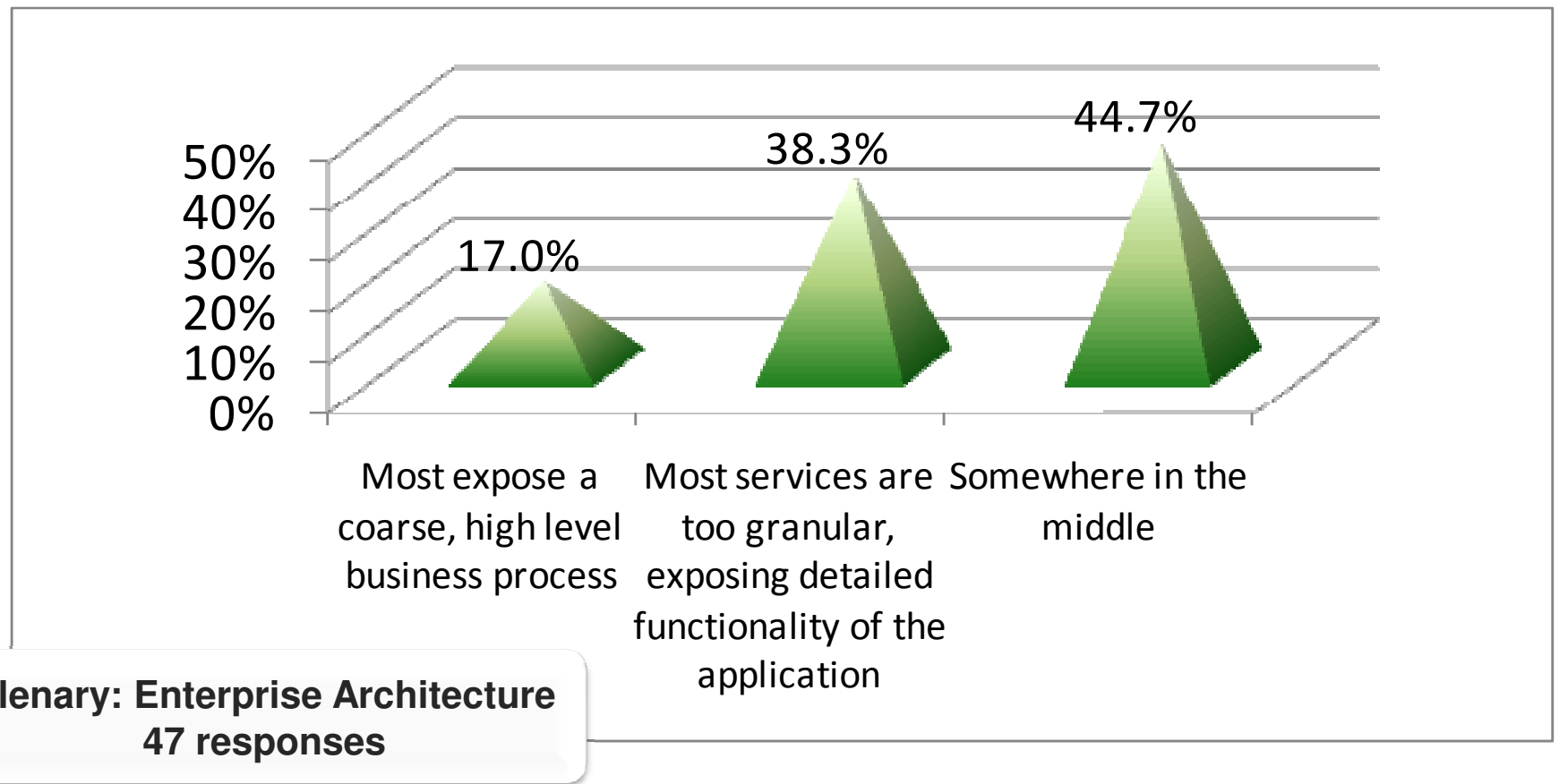

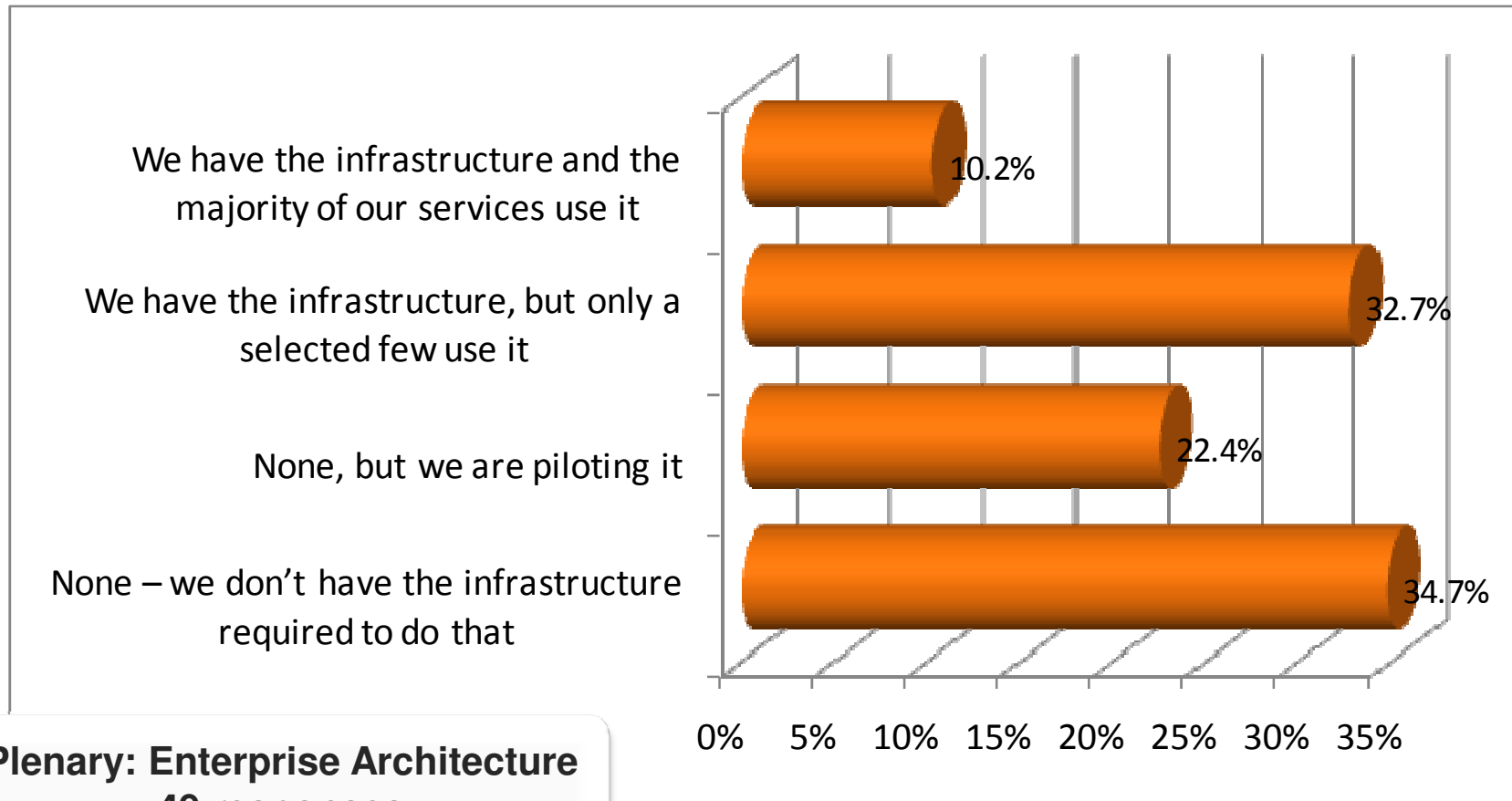
Web Services Implementation



Web Services Granularity

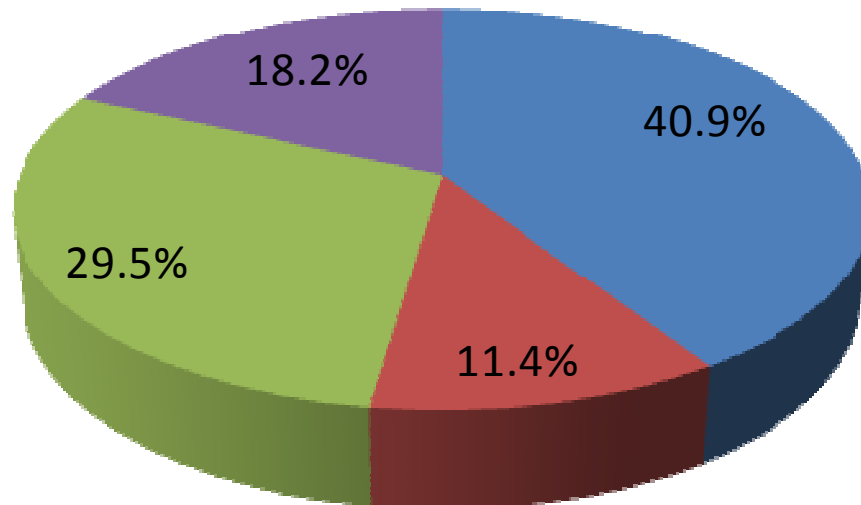

Web Services Wrapping

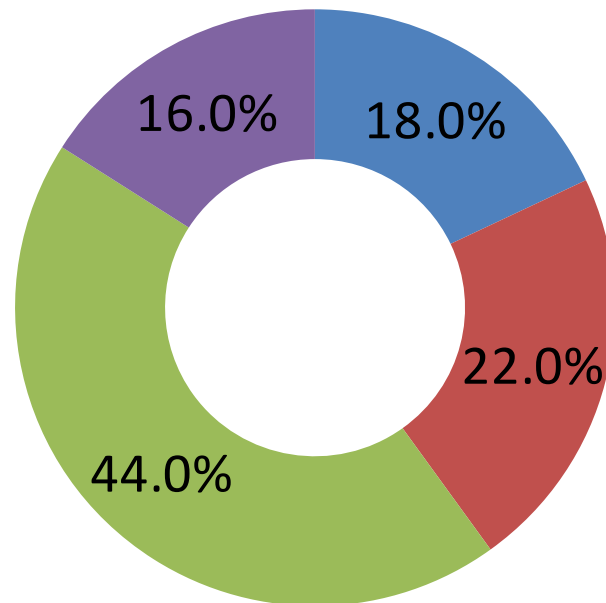

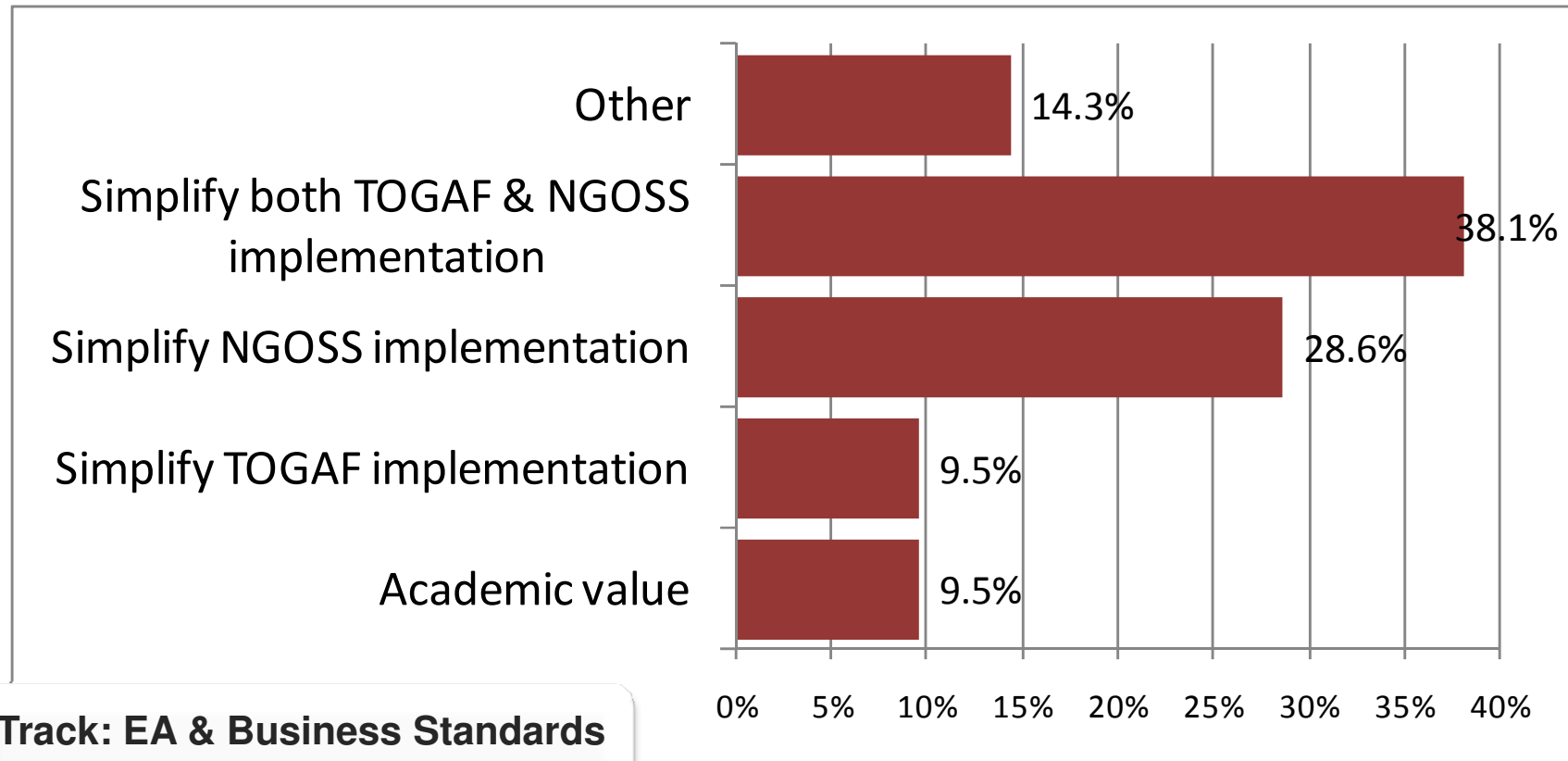
Business Standards Role



Industry Standard Participation



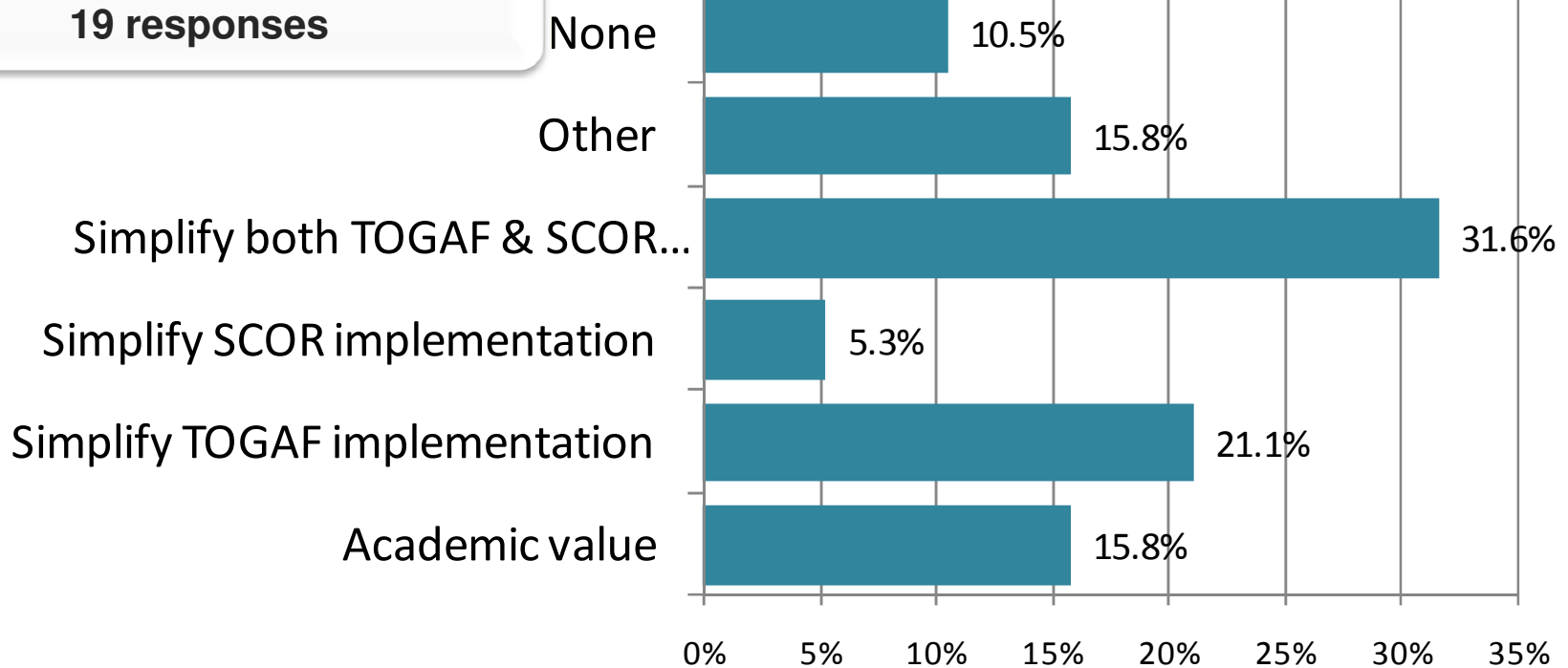

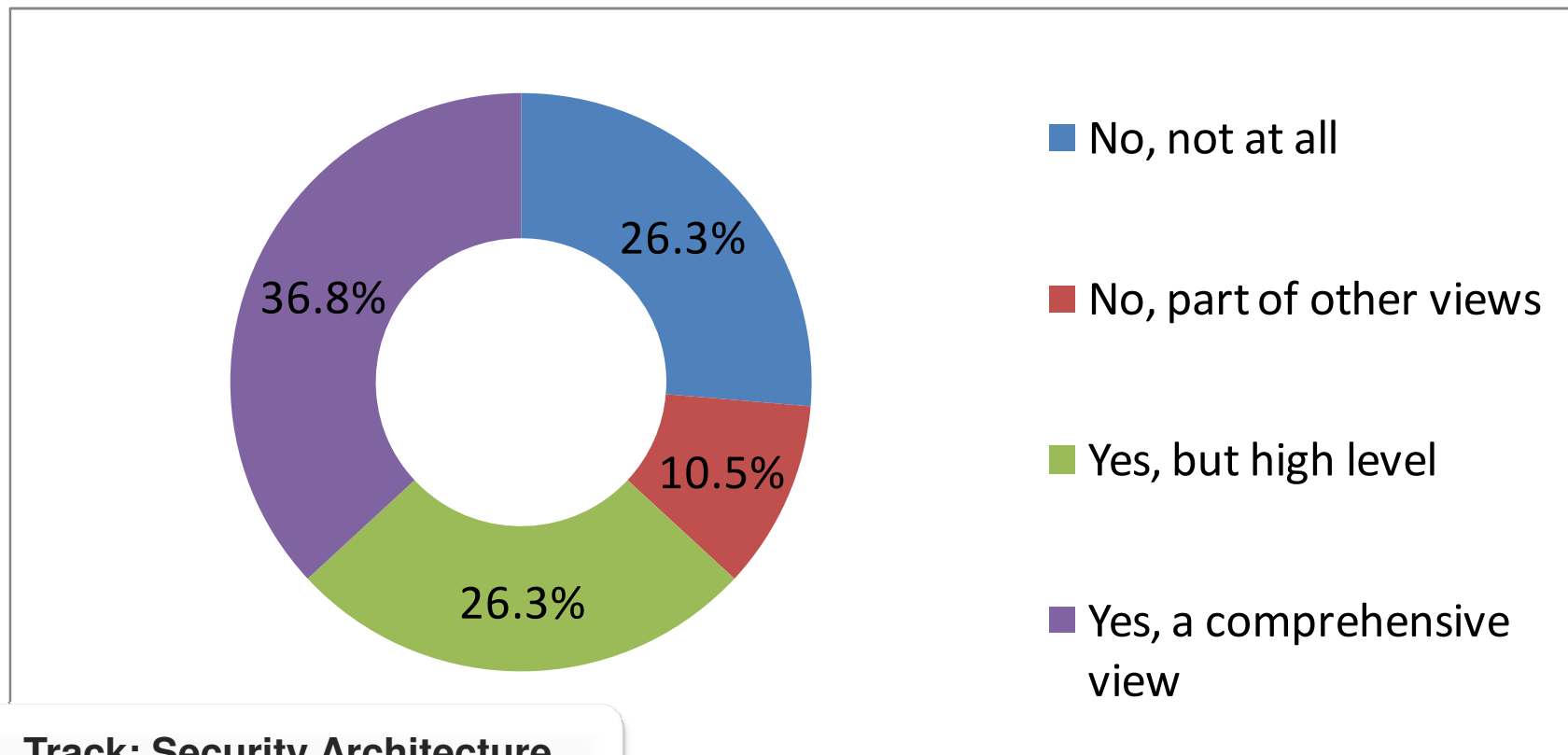

Web 2.0 Security

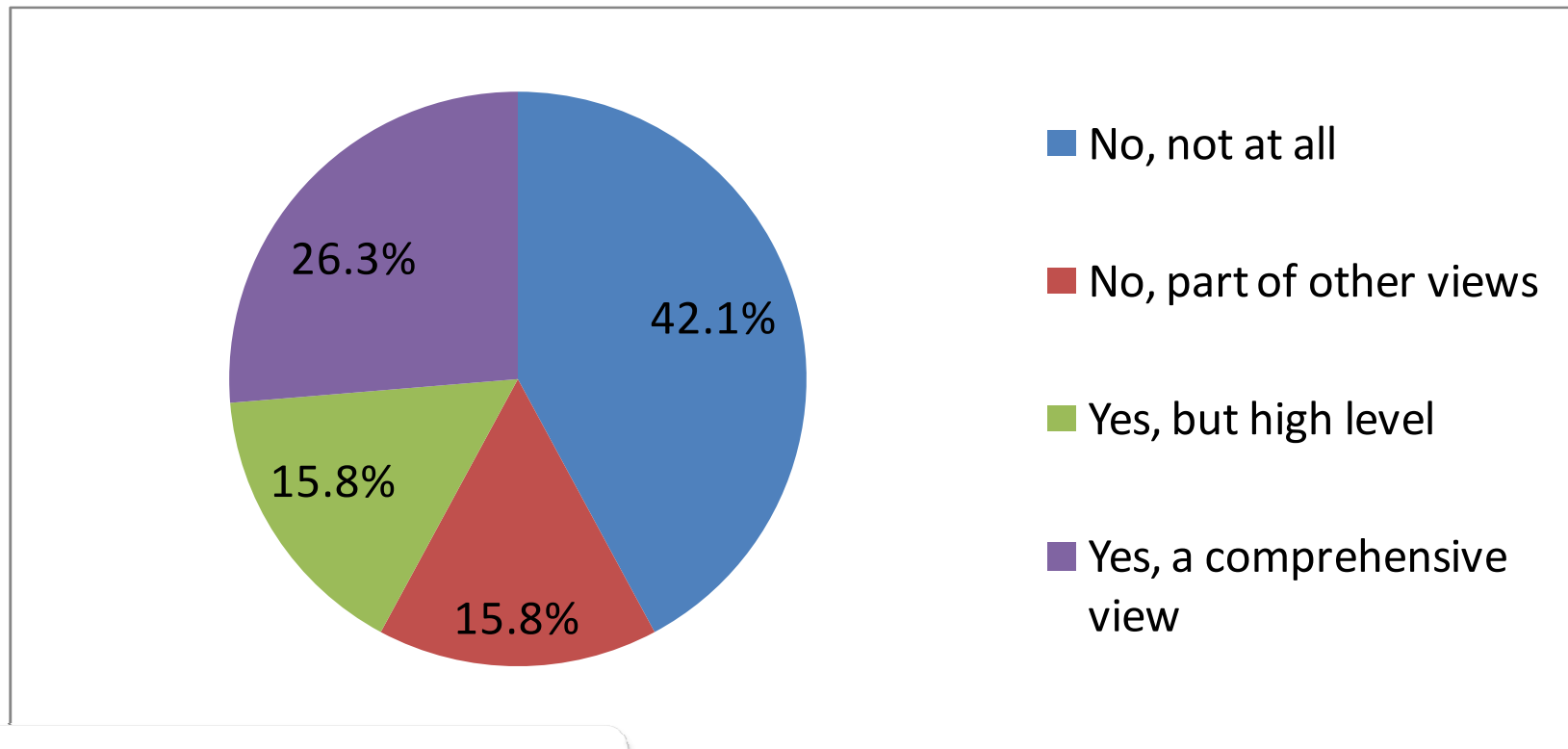


Security Views in Architecture
