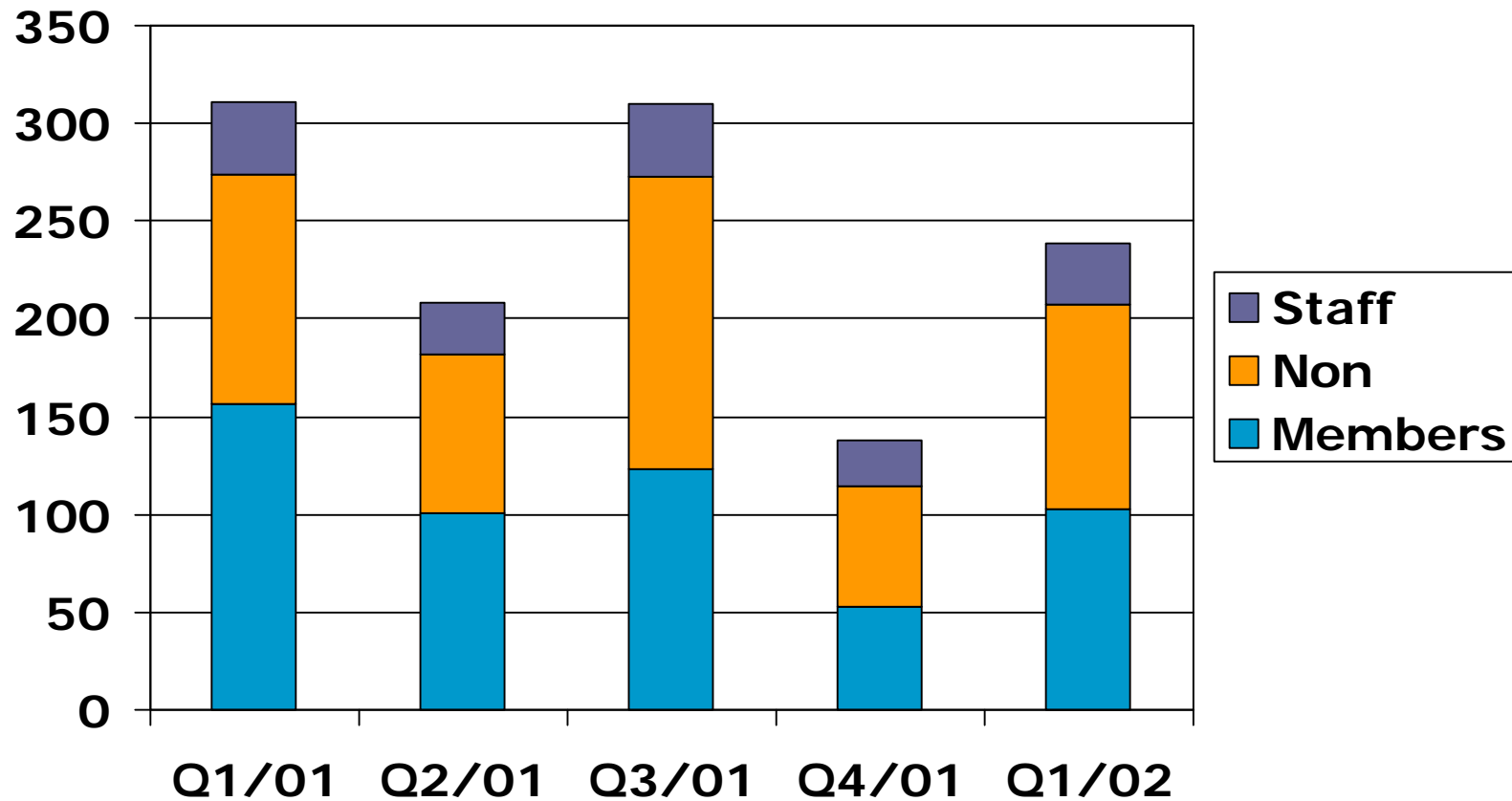

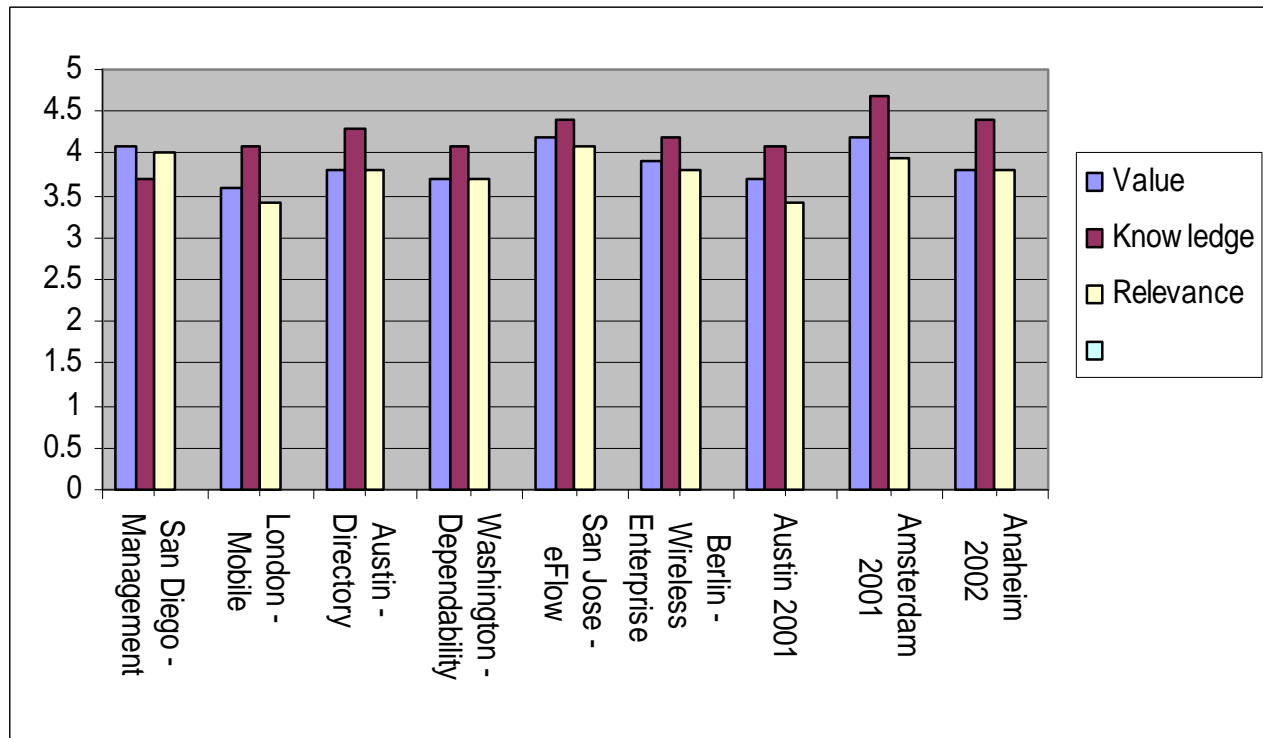

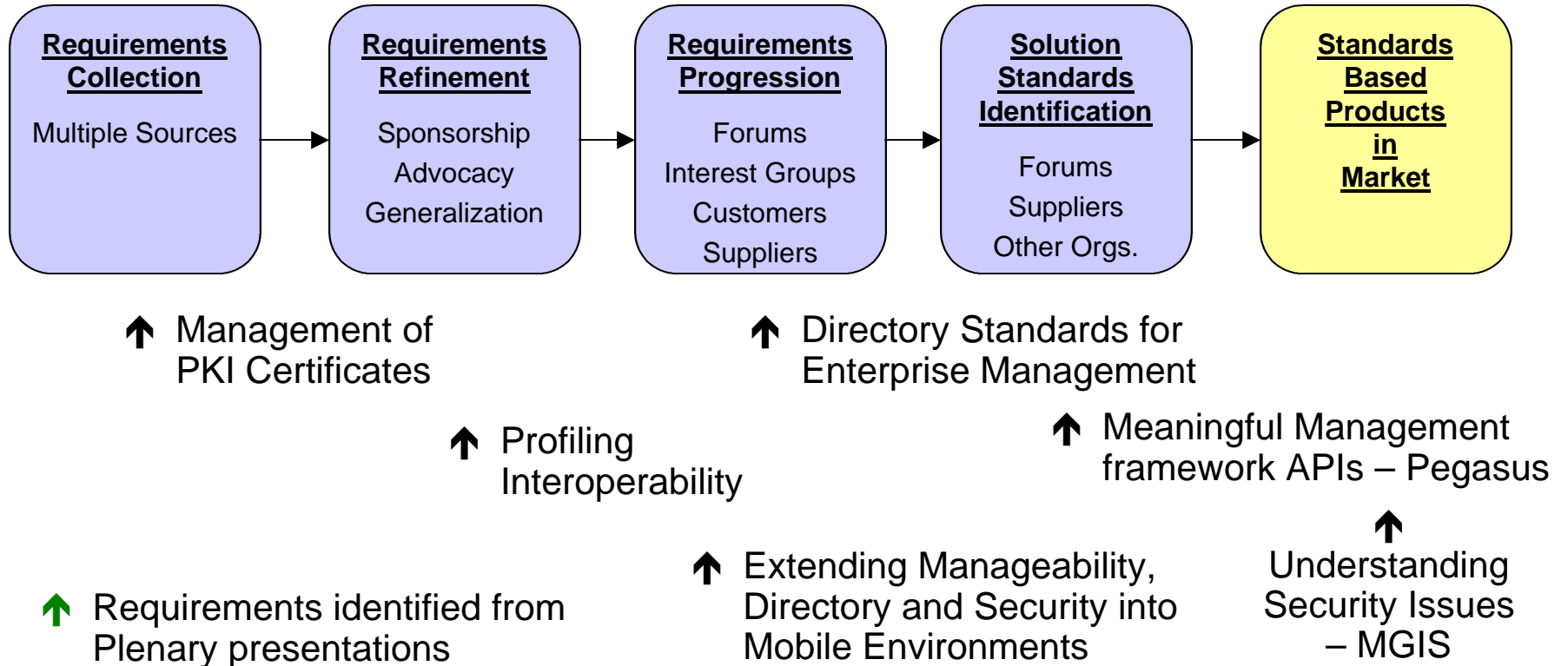

  - 55 attendees
  - Agreement to develop framework to cooperate through The Open Group RT&ES

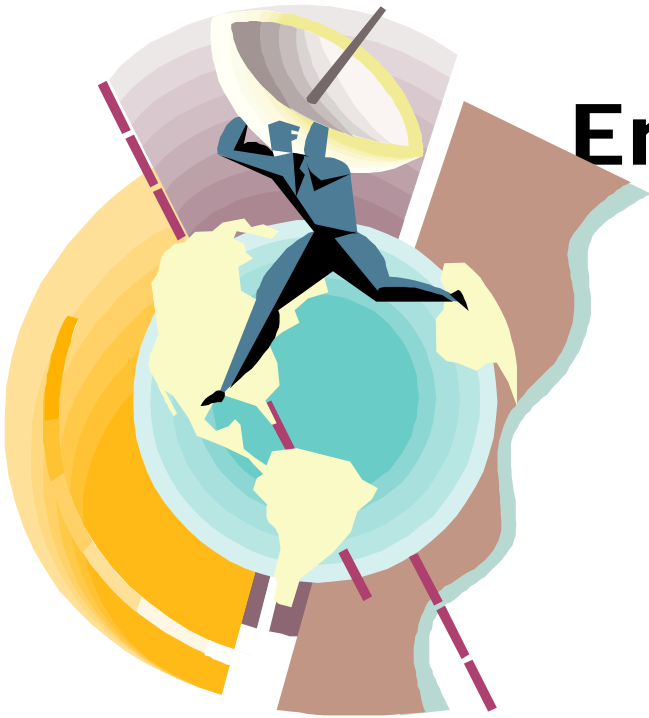

# EMF – Next Steps

---

- ❑ Start work on Manager's Guide to Manageability

- ❑ Freeze Pegasus Version 2.0 functionality to concentrate on debugging and quality control in preparation for code to be shipped in vendor's products
- ❑ Plan focus on Application Management projects – AIC, ARM, XSLM
