



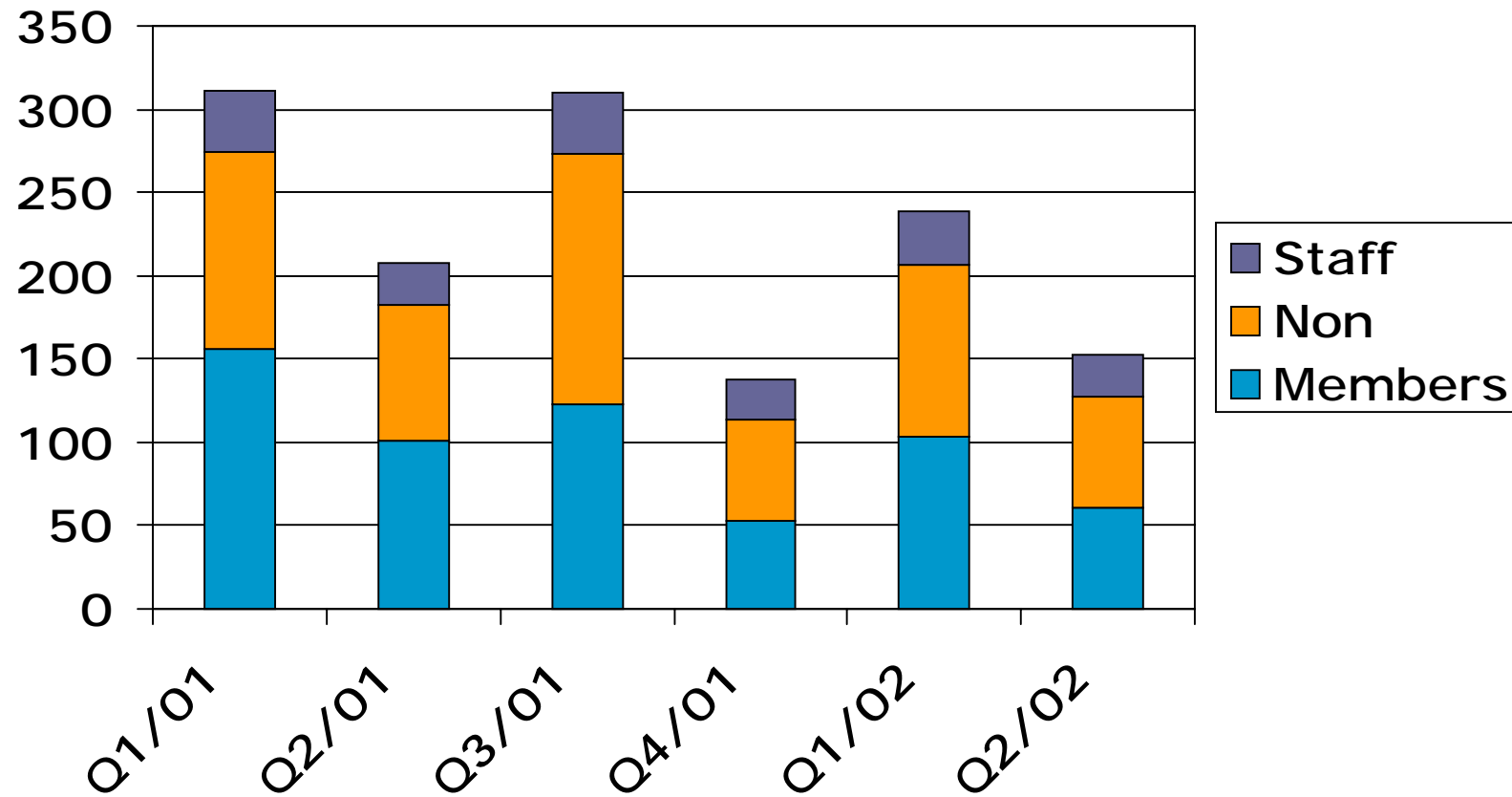

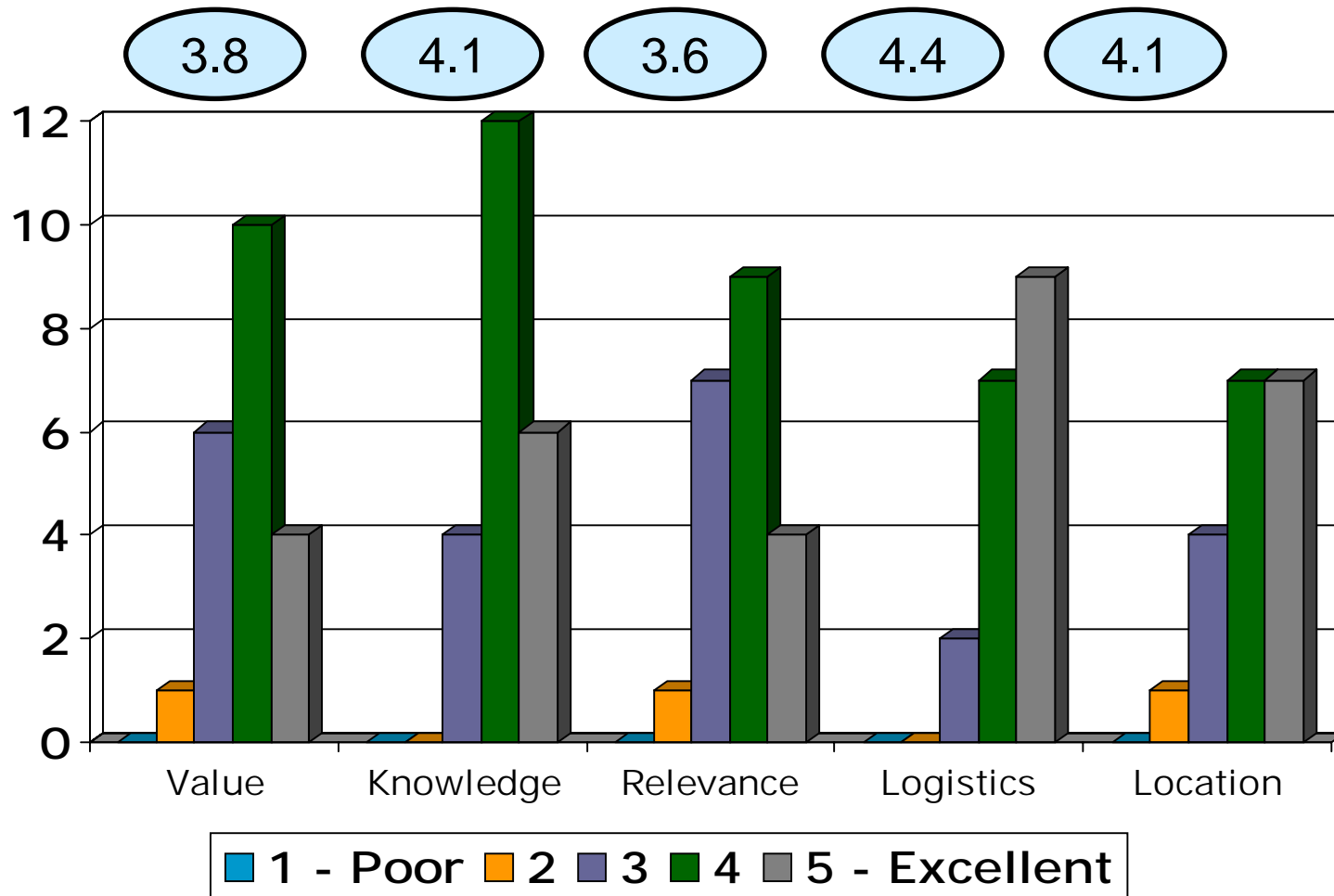

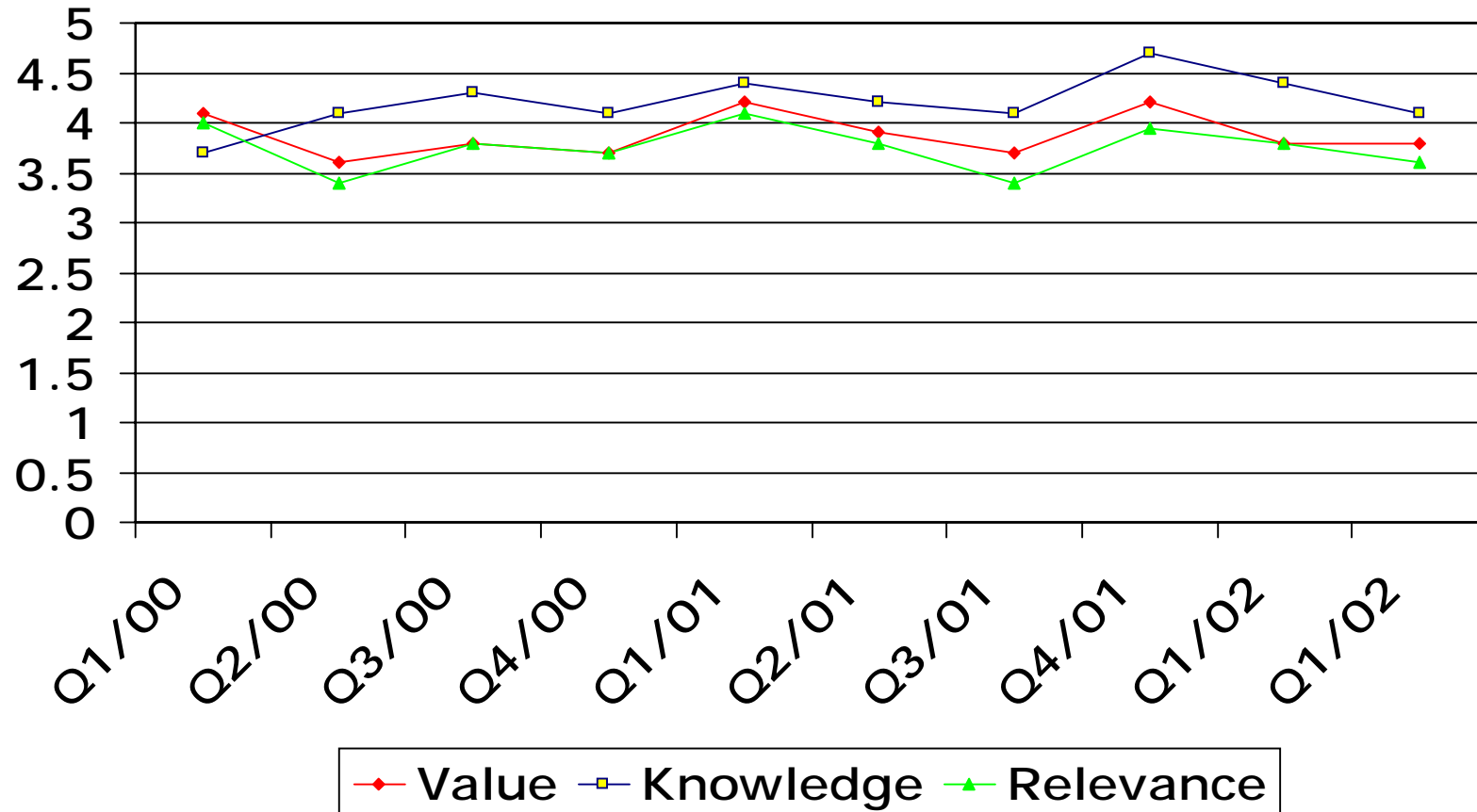


Paris Conference Feedback

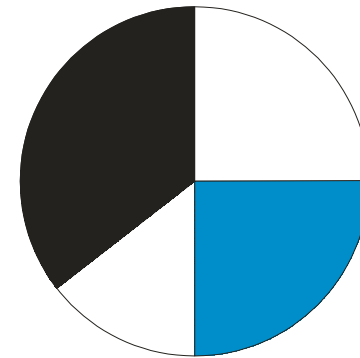

 - Version 2 planned for July
 - Implemented as IBM License Manager

Report on RT Working Groups



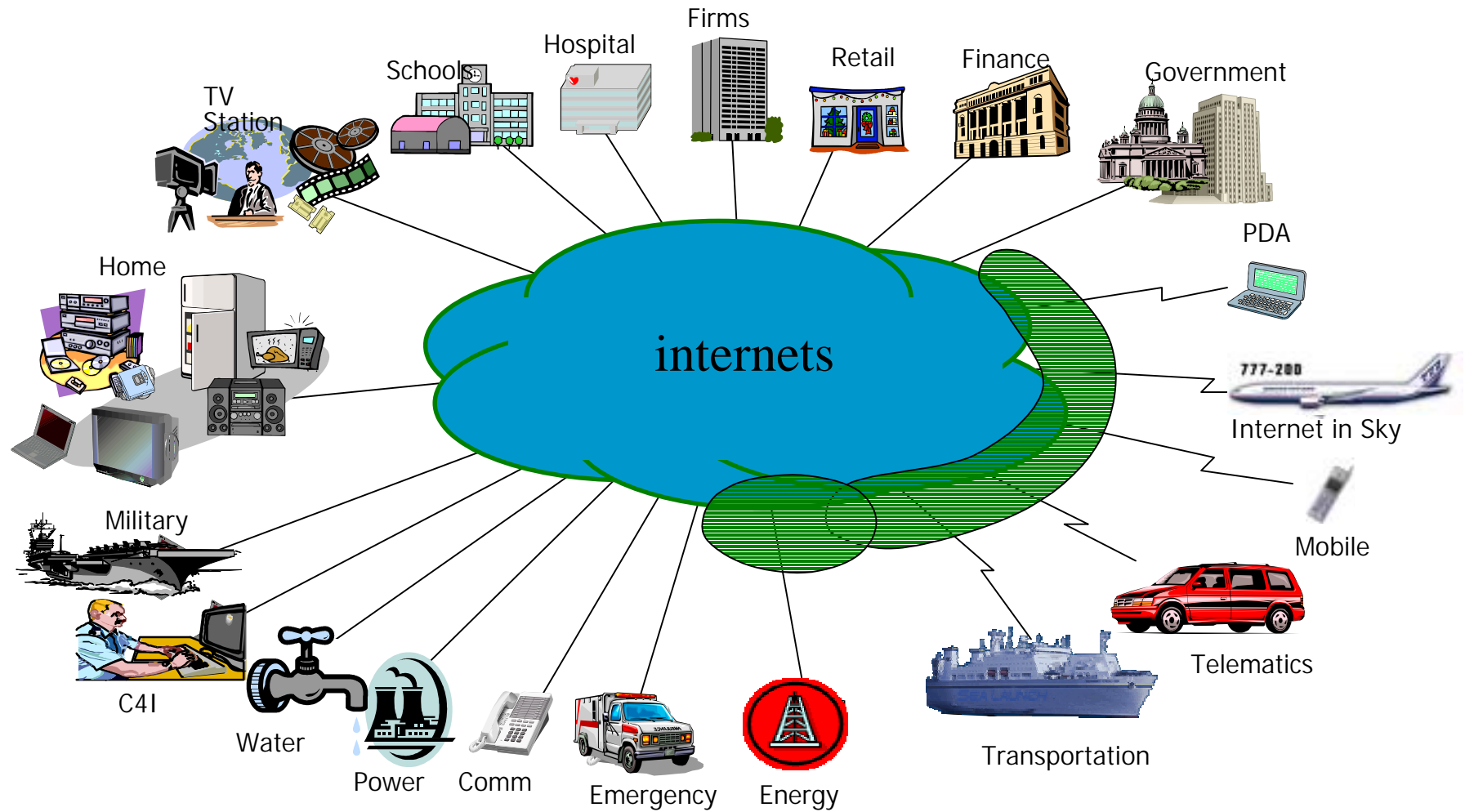
- ❑ **RT&ES Forum committed to In³**
- ❑ **Testing and Certification Group** -- Did not meet
- ❑ **Real-time Profiling Group** -- Update from IEEE PASC SSWG RT-- APIs for Trace. IEEE PASC SSWG RT WG to collocate at Boston Conference.
- ❑ **Joint Real-time and QoS Working Group** -- Successful meeting – to be reported by Jean Hammond.
- ❑ **Hard Real-time Java** -- Proposal from Real-time Java Expert Group for The Open Group RT&ES Forum to convene expert group to develop specifications for Special Use RT Java.
- ❑ **Security for Real-time and Embedded Systems Group** – One hour teleconference – decision made to hold additional teleconferences to accelerate work prior to July meeting – Security Use Cases, Protection Profile Development, etc.
- ❑ **Safety Critical** --White Paper to have final review at July meeting

- ❑ Review of candidate activities in support of In³
- ❑ Business Guides
 - MGIS published – well received
 - Data Privacy well advanced
- ❑ Active Loss Prevention
 - Joint meeting – on risk/loss management.
 - Good, lively initial engagement & exchange
- ❑ Security Design Patterns
 - 1st draft now out for peer review.
 - Much interest from the design patterns community.
 - Further review of status and what is needed to complete Version 1.

Security Forum – to Boston

- ❑ Guide to Data Privacy - Business Guide
 - Content complete in 2 weeks
 - Editorial Board being formed
 - Aim for publication by Boston meeting
- ❑ Security Design Patterns
 - Draft 1 now out for initial review
 - Concurrent development of proxy patterns to complete Version 1
- ❑ Follow-up on In³-related items:
 - Essays on security and the challenges of integration
 - E.g. The nature of effective security for networked systems & federated data
