What does Melstar do?

- Integration with third party software
- The existing data sources including address books and databases

How do companies justify moving to a new environment?

AutoCAD, Photoshop, TIFF, BMP, JPEG and a lot more



Manual Approach

- Analyse individual MSOffice[™] macros
- Direct one to one mapping of the Macro functionality
- Review and test
- Delivery and acceptance



Conversion of Macros and other customisations..cont

Semi Automatic Approach

(Shared Macro Library)

- Review a MSOffice[™] macro set
- Analyse the set to ascertain the macro functionality common to most
- Use or develop generic shared libraries, usable by multiple macros
- Map macro functionality
- Review and test
- Delivery and acceptance



Conversion of Macros and other customisations..cont

Automated Approach

- Converter accepts MSOffice application as input
- Imports MSOffice[™] documents in OpenOffice/StarOffice[™] formats
- Converts OpenOffice/StarOfficeTM Macros, avoiding "Commenting" of MSOfficeTM macro code
- Displays messages for unconverted sections of macros for manual conversion
- Provides "optional code" prompts for unconverted sections
- Would be enriched over time to approach total conversion



Support for Application Conversion

- Combination of onsite and offshore operations depending on cost and scope
- Potential 24x7 support for application conversion
 - Service Level Agreements available for attendance onsite and for remote resolution
- A Knowledge Net for knowledge gained
- Web-based down-load for new macros/shared library developed
- Development of automated tools
- Quality assurance



Factors affecting costs

Factors affecting cost

- Each organisation has different complexity of macro's and templates
- Some are one hour conversions while others can take a day or two per macro
- Macro conversion costs can range from £300 to £1000
- Volume conversion will reduce costs considerably
- Site access for testing for more complex macros and 3rd party integrations may have an effect on time taken to complete migration



Conclusion

- Migrating macros used to be a bit like moving your bank account to a different bank – difficult, labour intensive and took a long time because the macros are specific to the desktop package used to create them
- Recoding by hand was a lengthy, and hence costly, process
- Now with Melstar's service, methodology and tools, the pain has been removed
- What was once thought of as an expensive, complicated IT process has become cost-effective and easy to do with migration costs significantly reduced using Melstar
